

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission— January 7, 2025

At 9:00 a.m., Chairman Bergquist called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Jerry Bergquist, Levi Taylor, Chad Wolsky, Amanda Hastings, and Mike Hansen answered the roll call.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Commissioner Taylor requested to add an update on the Road Superintendent position posting. A motion to approve the amended agenda was made by Taylor, seconded by Hastings. Motion carried.

A motion to approve the December 2024 meeting minutes was made by Wolsky, seconded by Bergquist. Motion carried.

Dorene Stroh, Jamestown City Assessor, presented an abatement request for parcel number 74-2181240, owned by Alpha Opportunities Inc. and has been approved by Jamestown City Council. This property will be established as a group home and would qualify for tax exemptions under NDCC 57-02-08(31) reducing the value by \$136,519. A motion to approve the abatement was made by Taylor, seconded by Wolsky. Roll call vote: Hansen, Hastings, Wolsky, Taylor, and Bergquist voted aye. Motion carried.

Travis Dillman, Interstate Engineering, presented a request to sign a letter of noninterference with County projects for the proposed 96" storm sewer replacement project in the City of Jamestown. A motion to sign the letter to the City of Jamestown was made by Hastings, seconded by Hansen. Motion carried.

Shannon Davis, HR Director, requested the approval of anticipated 2025 Stutsman County wages to be published. A motion to approve the 2025 wages was made by Taylor, seconded by Hastings. Roll Hastings, Wolsky, Taylor, Bergquist, and Hansen voted aye. Motion carried.

Davis presented the 2025 mileage rates at \$0.70 per mile which has been set by US General Services Administration. A motion to approve the 2025 mileage rates as of January 1st, 2025 was made by Wolsky, seconded by Hastings. Roll call vote: Wolsky, Taylor, Bergquist, Hansen, and Hastings voted aye. Motion carried.

Davis presented an update on the Christmas Eve and January 9th Closures. Davis stated that the Special Meeting on January 9th is still scheduled take place.

Davis presented an update on the Road Superintendent position stating that Jesse Christianson was the only applicant and is currently employed with the Road Department.

Jessica Moser, Emergency Manager, presented the LEPC roster update. A motion to approve the updated Local Emergency Planning Committee roster was approved by Bergquist, seconded by Hastings. Motion carried.

Fritz Fremgen, State's Attorney, presented his monthly report and an update on current open cases. Fritz stated that the Victims of Crime Act grant was awarded in the amount of \$25,042.00 higher than anticipated which totaled \$79,500.00.

Jessica Alonge, Auditor/COO, requested approval for the 2025 payments on demand for bills received in between meetings, if necessary. A motion to approve the 2025 payments on demand was made by Hastings, seconded by Taylor. Motion carried.

Alonge requested to move from the State office to the office of Widmer Roel for the 2024 audit and future audits due to a working relationship with individuals at the company and the amount of time it takes the

state to perform audits. A motion to have Widmer Roel perform the audits was made by Wolsky, seconded by Hastings. Roll call vote: Taylor, Bergquist, Wolsky, Hastings, and Hansen voted aye. Motion carried.

Alonge presented an asset forfeiture request from the Drug Task Force. Chad Kaiser, Sheriff, explained where the funds from asset forfeitures come from and stated that these funds can only be used for specific purposes within the law enforcement departments. A motion to approve the asset forfeiture request was made by Taylor, seconded by Hansen. Roll call vote: Bergquist, Hansen, Hastings, Wolsky, and Taylor voted aye. Motion carried.

At 9:59 a.m., the Commission recessed for the County Park Board meeting.
