

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission – January 18, 2022

At 3:30 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Dennis Ova (via phone), Ramone Gumke (via phone), Joan Morris, Steven Cichos, and Mark Klose answered the roll call.

Jim Fettig, Maintenance Supervisor, requested permission to replace carpeting at the Extension building. He would like to purchase as much carpet as possible for the hallways, offices, and reception area to stay within the budgeted \$20,000. Cichos made a motion to approve the carpet project, seconded by Morris. Ova, Gumke, Morris, Cichos, and Klose voted aye. Motion carried.

Jessica Alonge, Auditor/COO, presented the designation of depositories. Statute requires that depositories be approved every even numbered year. The banks that have responded that they are interested in being designated as depositories are: Bank Forward, Dacotah Bank, Dakota Heritage Bank, First Community Credit Union, Gate City Bank, Unison Bank, US Bank, and Wells Fargo. Morris made a motion to approve, seconded by Gumke. Morris, Cichos, Klose, and Ova voted aye. Motion carried.

At 3:35 p.m., the Commission recessed for the County Park Board meeting.

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Park Board – January 18, 2022

At 3:36 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Park Board to order. Dennis Ova (via phone), Ramone Gumke (via phone), Joan Morris, Steven Cichos, Mark Klose, and Robert Martin (via phone) were present. Merri Morridian was absent.

Karl Bergh, Park Superintendent, discussed mowing at the Ypsilanti Park. The Dale Marks family has been mowing the park and would be interested in continuing in 2022. They charge \$600 for the season. Morris made a motion to allow the Marks family to mow the park in 2022 for \$600, seconded by Cichos. Morris, Cichos, Klose, Martin, Ova, and Gumke voted aye. Motion carried.

Bergh discussed park updates and reports. The last private dock was moved on December 19th. Camping for 2022 is opened six months in advance, and they already have 113 reservations through the middle of July. He has been keeping the walking path open at the reservoir, but it takes a lot of time when there is heavy snow and there have been equipment issues. The road department has been helping. Ideally, he would like a snowblower that attaches to the skid steer that the department already owns. They run around \$7,600. He will add it to the budget for next year and continue to look for options in the off season. Game and Fish is reimbursing the county for pumping the fish cleaning station and will pay for parts and wheels for the docks. He is also looking into a grant that supplies life vests for public use. Interstate Engineering is still working on the bridge project to the island. They are recommending doing a box culvert. They still need to purchase playground equipment to fulfill the Garrison Diversion grant. They could replace the equipment near the Farmer's Union camp, in the campground, or pick a new location.

Bergh also submitted a grant to DOT to pave the road in the campground. Border States estimated \$100,000 for a 16-foot-wide road. Interstate Engineering has looked at it and recommended a 20 foot road which would cost \$140,000.

Cichos made a motion to approve the mid-month bills, seconded by Gumke. Cichos, Klose, Martin, Ova, Gumke, and Martin voted aye. Motion carried.
