Jim Fettig, Maintenance Supervisor, requested approval to accept a courthouse facility grant. The grant was approved for a new heat pump. The grant total was \$8,280. The grant money received will be \$6,210, and the county share will be approximately \$2,070. Ova made a motion to approve, seconded by Morris. Motion carried.

Steve Attleson, Scherbenske Inc – requested \$340,000.00 past due bill to be paid and upcoming bill of \$839,400.00. Andrew Kirking, Emergency Manager stated that all paperwork has been submitted to FEMA. The county is waiting for FEMA to reimburse the county for this project, but it is taking longer than expected. A motion to pay first invoice of \$340,000.00 in the bills approved today was made by Morris, seconded by Gumke. Ova, Gumke, Morris, Cichos, and Klose voted aye. Motion carried.

Fritz Fremgen, State's Attorney, presented his monthly report. There has only been one application for the Assistant State's Attorney position. The applicant is not licensed and is a 3-year law student.

Fremgen requested to hire an intern law student from UND using the unexpended salaries in the State's Attorney budget. The amount requested is for up to \$8,000.00, 400 hours, at \$20.00 an hour. Morris made a motion to approve, seconded by Gumke. Gumke, Morris, Cichos, Klose, and Ova voted aye. Motion carried.

Shannon Larson, Human Resource Director requested to payout unused annual leave of 5 employees. The payout would be paid using the employees 2021 salary rate due to extenuating circumstances. A motion to approve the request was made by Cichos, seconded by Ova. Morris, Cichos, Klose, Ova, and Gumke all voted aye. Motion carried.

Larson presented Library Board Appointments. There are two applicants with one position open. Morris indicated appointments must be made in conformance with open meetings regulations. Morris made a motion to appoint Gail Martin to the library board, seconded by Ova. Cichos, Klose, Ova, and Morris voted aye. Gumke voted no. Motion carried.

Jessica Alonge, Auditor/COO, requested a motion to remove Jessica Moser from the financial accounts. Current signors are Jessica Alonge and Susan Koropatnicki. A motion to remove Jessica Moser was made by Cichos, seconded by Ova. Motion carried.

Alonge requested additional budget transfers between funds. Cichos made a motion to approve, seconded by Ova. Klose, Ova, Gumke, Morris, and Cichos all voted aye. Motion carried.
