

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission—February 7, 2023

At 3:30 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Jerry Bergquist, Chad Wolsky, Joan Morris, Steven Cichos (via phone) and Mark Klose answered the roll call.

A motion was made by Bergquist to approve the January 2023 minutes, seconded by Cichos. Motion carried.

Mark Attleson, Maintenance Engineer, presented bids for carpeting the LEC and a new washing machine for the jail. Total for the carpeting is \$9,954.74 within the budget of \$10,000 and \$6,744 for new washer, within the budget of \$8,000. A motion to approve the requests was made by Bergquist, seconded by Wolsky. Roll call vote: Bergquist, Wolsky, Morris, Cichos and Klose voted aye. Motion carried.

Jim Wentland, Road Superintendent, requested approval to advertise for new motor grader. A motion to approve advertisement was made by Cichos, seconded by Wolsky. Motion carried.

Wentland notified the board of an immediate employee resignation resulting in a job opening in the road department. Wentland suggested a 5% increase in wages to keep up with city and rural competitors. Morris suggested a departmental salary survey be done before making any decisions. No action was taken.

Jim Fettig, Maintenance Supervisor, presented two Courthouse facility grants that were approved totaling \$50,868.69 with the county share being \$12,717.17. Fettig requested approval to use the funds to remodel and replace the furniture in the front lobby of District Court. Fettig also requested approval to purchase and install ADA compliant doors during the remodel that would not be covered by either of the grants. The total cost for ADA doors and installation is \$33,459.17. A motion to approve the grants and purchase of the ADA doors was made by Bergquist, seconded by Cichos. Roll call vote: Wolsky, Morris, Cichos, Klose, and Bergquist voted aye. Motion carried.

Fettig presented a request to tile the restroom in the extension office as part of the carpet replacement project, which is a carryover from a 2022 project. The total cost including material and labor would be \$2,000 and there is money left in the carpet replacement budget. A motion to approve was made by Cichos, seconded by Bergquist. Roll call vote: Morris, Cichos, Klose, Bergquist, and Wolsky voted aye. Motion carried.

Chad Kaiser, Sheriff, re-visited a building project proposed for the building near the Park Department shop. A motion to re-advertise for bids was made by Bergquist, seconded by Wolsky. Roll call vote: Cichos, Klose, Bergquist, Wolsky, and Morris voted aye. Motion carried.

Kaiser requested permission to purchase new body cameras and replace patrol vehicle cameras. The original budget for patrol vehicle cameras is \$71,500, for purchase in 2024. As of 2023, there will be \$61,490 in fund balance. The total quote for both body and patrol vehicle cameras is \$41,152. A motion to approve the purchase of the cameras was made by Morris, seconded by Wolsky. Roll call vote: Klose, Bergquist, Wolsky, Morris, and Cichos voted aye. Motion carried.

Kaiser notified the board that he was accepted and will be attending the FBI National Academy.

Fritz Fremgen, State's Attorney, presented his monthly report. Fremgen requested permission to hire a summer law clerk at \$20/hour for 400 hours totaling \$8,000. A motion to advertise a position for a

summer law clerk was made by Cichos, seconded by Morris. Roll call vote: Wolsky, Morris, Cichos, Klose and Bergquist voted aye. Motion carried.

Bruce Hanson & Rory Somsen, ND Sons of Liberty, presented a proposed ordinance which would make Stutsman County a 2<sup>nd</sup> Amendment Sanctuary County. Revisions were suggested by Fremgen. No action was taken.

Shannon Davis, Human Resources Director, requested the approval of the payout of unused annual leave. A motion was made by Wolsky, seconded by Bergquist. Roll call vote: Wolsky, Morris, Cichos, Klose, and Bergquist voted aye. Motion carried.

Jerry Bergquist, County Commissioner, proposed the formation of a committee to participate in April's County Government Month to spread awareness of the role of county government and its many functions.

Bergquist presented proposals from Northern Pacific Airways and SkyWest Airlines. Bergquist recommends SkyWest Charter be awarded the 2023-2025 DOT Essential Air Service contract for Jamestown Regional Airport with connections to Denver with United Express and Minneapolis with Delta. A motion to approve sending the proposed letter of support was made by Bergquist, seconded by Wolsky. Motion carried.

Chairman Klose presented the extension for the memorandum of understanding regarding the joint library board agreement between the city and the county. A motion to extend the notice of intent to withdraw requirement in the MOU for one year was made by Bergquist, seconded by Wolsky. Motion carried.

Commissioner Morris stated she was in favor of the one-year extension. Morris presented her concerns with the funding and budget of the consolidated library. Joe Rector, Director, James River Valley Library System, discussed the library services and budget.

Roll call vote on the motion to extend the notice of intent to withdraw requirement: Morris, Klose, Bergquist, and Wolsky voted aye. Cichos did not respond. Motion carried.

Commissioner Morris proposed that herself, Commissioner Bergquist and Alonge study cost for a standalone library and other alternatives available. A motion to form the committee was made by Morris, seconded by Bergquist.

Cichos stated he was in favor of formation of the committee and that he agreed with the previous motion to extend the MOU but was muted at roll call.

Roll call vote on the motion to form the library committee: Cichos, Klose, Bergquist, Wolsky, and Morris voted aye. Motion carried. Commissioner Bergquist, Commissioner Morris and Alonge will be on the committee.

At 5:39 P.M., the Commission recessed for the County Park Board meeting.

At 5:40 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Park Board to order. Jerry Bergquist, Joan Morris, Mark Klose, Steven Cichos, Chad Wolsky, and Robert Martin answered the roll call. Merri Mooridian was absent.

Karl Bergh, Park Superintendent, requested permission to purchase a skid steer from the road department for \$7,500. Bergh has \$10,000 in his 2023 budget for the purchase of a truck, which is no longer necessary after the maintenance truck and plow was transferred to his department. Bergh requested reallocating the funds for purchase of the skidsteer. A motion to approve the purchase was made by Cichos, seconded by Wolsky. Roll call vote: Klose, Martin, Bergquist, Wolsky, Morris, and Cichos voted aye. Motion carried.

Bergh presented a request to sell an older truck at auction. A motion to allow the sale was made by Martin, seconded by Morris. Roll call vote: Martin, Bergquist, Wolsky, Morris, Cichos, and Klose voted aye. Motion carried.

A motion to approve payment of the monthly bills was made by Morris, seconded by Wolsky. Roll call vote: Bergquist, Wolsky, Morris, Cichos, Klose, and Martin voted aye. Motion carried.
