Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission — March 4, 2025

At 9:00 a.m., Chairman Bergquist called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Jerry Bergquist, Chad Wolsky, Amanda Hastings, and Mike Hansen answered the roll call. Levi Taylor was absent.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

A motion to approve the agenda was made by Hastings, seconded by Hansen. Motion carried.

A motion to approve the February 2025 meeting minutes was made by Hastings, seconded by Bergquist. Motion carried.

Chairman Bergquist presented an update on Senate bill 2208, which would restrict funding to townships and counties regarding zoning ordinances, stating that the bill did not pass.

Josh Loosemore, Peritiacon LLC, presented an update on the Crystal Springs Watershed Initiative and stated that there may be need for an extension of the contract.

Jesse Christianson, Highway Superintendent, requested to purchase a Walk-n-Roll packer with the accumulator in the amount of \$27,245, which has been budgeted for. A motion to approve this purchase was made by Wolsky, seconded by Hastings. Roll call vote: Hansen, Hastings, Wolsky, and Bergquist voted aye. Motion carried.

Joelle Vanderlinden, LoadPass Permits, presented an electronic permitting system for non-divisible overweight and oversized loads on participating county, township, and city roadways, bridges, and small structures. LoadPass allows counties, cities, and townships to post load restrictions, road closings, restrictions lifted, construction projects, and frost law events. This allows entities to retain control of local roads, increase revenues for road maintenance, reporting road segments and notifications, and preparation for future projects. Vanderlinden stated that the initial set up and training fee is \$1,500 and that the subsequent yearly charges are based on the number of permits sold in the prior year. A motion to join LoadPass Permitting Systems was made by Hastings, seconded by Hansen. Roll call vote: Hastings, Wolsky, Bergquist, and Hansen voted aye. Motion carried.

Christianson requested to advertise chip seal bids for 2025. A motion to advertise the chip seal bids was made by Wolsky, seconded by Hansen. Motion carried.

Shannon Davis, HR Director, presented the 2025 National County Government Month activities that take place in April. Bergquist recommended Commissioner Hastings to join the committee.

Davis presented an update on the Treasurer/Recorder.

Jessica Alonge, Auditor/COO, presented the proposed 2025 Joint Powers Agreement with Foster County for Emergency Management Services. Alonge stated that this agreement had previously been made in April 2024 to December 2024 due to Foster County not having an Emergency Manager for over 2 years. Foster County requested to add addressing services to the agreement for 2025. A motion to adopt the Joint Powers Agreement was made by Hastings, seconded by Wolsky. Roll call vote: Wolsky, Bergquist, Hansen, and Hastings voted aye. Motion carried.

Alonge presented the 2025 South Central Dakota Regional Council Joint Powers Agreement. A motion to adopt the 2025 SCDRC Joint Powers Agreement was made by Hansen, seconded by Hastings. Roll call vote: Bergquist, Hansen, Hastings, and Wolsky voted aye. Motion carried.

Alonge presented an asset forfeiture request in the amount of \$817.80. A motion to approve the asset forfeiture request and payment was made by Wolsky, seconded by Hansen. Roll call vote: Hansen, Hastings, Wolsky, and Bergquist voted aye. Motion carried.

Alonge presented a 2025 Farm Lease that the county has entered into for several years with Matt Greshik for parcel number 51-2730020 at \$70/acre. A motion to enter into the 2025 lease was made by Bergquist, seconded by Wolsky. Roll call vote: Hastings, Wolsky, Bergquist, and Hansen voted aye. Motion carried.

Tyler Perleberg, Tax Director, requested to hold the County Board of Equalization on June 3, 2025 at 8:30 a.m., and to delay the Commission meeting until 10 a.m. A motion to schedule the meetings for 8:30 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. was made by Hastings, seconded by Hansen. Motion carried.

Alonge presented the 2024 year-end fiscal report and requested approval of the 2024 budget amendments by fund. The County received \$32,105,749 in revenue and expended \$31,224,574 resulting in a net increase of \$881,175. A motion to approve the 2024 budget amendments by fund was made by Wolsky, seconded by Hastings. Roll call vote: Wolsky, Bergquist, Hansen, and Hastings voted aye. Motion carried.

At 10:53 a.m., the Commission recessed for the County Park Board meeting.

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Park Board — March 4, 2025

At 11:00 a.m., Chairman Bergquist called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Park Board to order. Mike Hansen, Amanda Hastings, Chad Wolsky, Jerry Bergquist, and Merri Mooridian (via phone) were present. Levi Taylor and Henry Steinberger were absent.

A motion to approve the agenda was made by Hansen, seconded by Wolsky. Motion carried.

A motion to approve the February meeting minutes was made by Hastings, seconded by Mooridian. Motion carried.

Davis presented an update for the park superintendent position. Davis there were a total of 3 applicants that did not work out. The position is being re-advertised.

Davis requested to retain Karl Bergh in a part-time position in the park department. This would allow him to help finish up ongoing projects at approximately 10 hours per week. Davis stated that the budget would allow for this position to be created for Bergh. A motion to create a park department part-time position to be filled by Bergh effective immediately at an hourly rate was made by Mooridian, seconded by Hastings. Roll call vote: Bergquist, Mooridian, Hansen, Hastings, and Wolsky voted aye. Motion carried.

Alonge presented an update regarding the MOA between Stutsman County and Farmers Union and stated that the amendments made by Farmers Union have not been reviewed by the Park Portfolio.

Alonge presented the 2025 reservoir dock permits along with the two grandfathered docks. Alonge stated that on the private dock permits there has been no opinion provided by the State's Attorney's Office, which was not available last year when dock permits were issued. Bergquist suggested waiting for action until the Park Portfolio has had a chance to discuss the permits.

Alonge presented the 2025 park project updates and approval requests. Alonge stated that the Park Board supported the agreement with the ND Game & Fish for the replacement of the Spiritwood Lake Dock which is a 25% match from the county totaling \$2,651.54 which does not include donations from the Dakota Anglers or Stutsman County Wildlife. A motion to approve the ND Game & Fish agreement was made by Wolsky, seconded by Hastings. Roll call vote: Mooridian, Hansen, Hastings, Wolsky, and Bergquist voted aye. Motion carried.

Alonge presented the agreement for Jamestown Reservoir fish cleaning station upgrades. Alonge stated that ND Game & Fish has purchased the equipment at a cost of \$63,000. The county's contribution would be with the relocation of shelters around the stations and any electrical or plumbing work. A total of \$20,000 has been budgeted from the county for this project. A motion to approve the ND Game & Fish contract for the fish cleaning stations was made by Mooridian, seconded by Hastings. Roll call vote: Hansen, Hastings, Wolsky, Bergquist, and Mooridian. Motion carried.

Alonge presented an update on the Pipestem Reservoir Ramp and stated that the ND Game & Fish is still looking at alternative solutions for the ramp.

Alonge presented an update on the West Lakeside Road discussion. Alonge stated that the next step is to get in touch with the state to see how to maintain the road before coming to the board for a decision on the Midco permit.

A motion to approve the monthly bills was made by Hastings, seconded by Bergquist. Roll call vote: Hastings, Wolsky, Bergquist, Mooridian, and Hansen voted aye. Motion carried.
