

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission— April 1, 2025

At 9:00 a.m., Chairman Bergquist called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Mike Hansen, Amanda Hastings, Chad Wolsky, Levi Taylor, and Jerry Bergquist answered roll.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

A motion to approve the agenda was made by Hastings, seconded by Wolsky. Unanimous aye vote. Motion carried.

A motion to approve the March 2025 meeting minutes was made by Wolsky, seconded by Hastings.

Scott Wheeler presented a request for a letter of support for the 70th anniversary of the Lawrence Welk Show, in order to raise awareness among the younger generations of Welk's contribution to music and television. A motion to sign the letter of support was made by Hastings, seconded by Taylor. Unanimous aye vote. Motion carried.

Updates were given on House Bills 1176, 1258 and 1591.

Michael Gunsch, Houston Engineering, presented an update and project review for the Crystal Springs feasibility study. A conference call will be arranged between the Kidder County Commission, Stutsman County Commission, and the Water Resource Board. The feasibility study is ongoing, and nothing is final at this point. A motion to accept the water board's recommendation for the extension of the feasibility study to end of July 2025 was made by Hastings, seconded by Wolsky. Unanimous aye vote. Motion carried.

Jesse Christianson, Road Superintendent, presented a request to purchase a 2016 F350 with service body in the amount of \$29,500. The purchase is in the 2025 budget. A motion to approve the request was made by Wolsky, seconded by Taylor. Roll call vote: Hansen, Hastings, Wolsky, Taylor, and Bergquist voted aye. Motion carried.

Christianson then requested to sell the 2009 Ford F150 at Northland Auto Auction, in Mandan. A motion to approve the request was made by Taylor, seconded by Hastings. Roll call vote: Hastings, Wolsky, Taylor, Bergquist, and Hansen voted aye. Motion carried.

Christianson also requested to trade the 2007 side dump trailer for a new 2025 trailer. He was offered \$32,000 for trade, with a net cost for the new trailer \$49,800. A motion to approve the trade and purchase was made by Taylor, seconded by Hastings. Roll call vote: Wolsky, Taylor, Bergquist, Hansen, and Hastings voted aye. Motion carried.

An RFP selection committee of Wolsky, Hansen, Christianson, and Dale Mielke will be formed for the upcoming Streeter and NE Cleveland construction engineering interviews.

Fritz Fremgen presented his monthly report. The VOCA grant funding is in place for the remainder of the fiscal year. Jessica Alonge, Auditor/COO, stated that there will be no special election for the Jamestown Ambulance this year.

Shannon Davis, Human Resource Director, requested appointment of, and introduced Dylan Kleinjan as Park Superintendent. Kleinjan has been employed in the county maintenance department since April 2024. A motion to approve the appointment was made by Hastings, seconded by Taylor. Roll call vote: Taylor, Bergquist, Hastings, Hansen, and Wolsky voted aye. Motion carried.

Davis also gave an update of the activities planned for county government month. Hastings organized a taco bar, sponsored by Interstate Engineering for all county employees. The maintenance department, veterans service office, communications and corrections will be highlighted during the month. There will also be an open house at the new sheriffs building on April 23.

Chad Kaiser, sheriff, request to purchase a 2025 Chevy Silverado 1500. The total amount of purchase after trade will be \$39,218. A motion to approve the purchase and trade was made by Hastings, seconded by Wolsky. Roll call vote: Bergquist, Hansen, Hastings, Wolsky, and Taylor voted aye. Motion carried.

Kaiser also presented a discussion on the Stutsman County Fairground parcels. The Fair Association owns half of the property, and the county owns the other half. The deed from 1960 transferring the land from the USA to the County states the Department of Interior must approve any changes in ownership. He is seeking approval on behalf of the Fair Board to contact the Bureau and inquire about transferring the County parcel to the Fair Association. A motion to support the request of Stutsman County Fair Association to begin the necessary steps for the transfer of the property was made by Hastings, seconded by Taylor. Roll call vote: Hansen, Hastings, Wolsky, Taylor, and Bergquist voted aye. Motion carried.

Alonge provided an update that the Jamestown Ambulance not pursuing a special election this year. Gackle Ambulance is requesting a meeting with all counties that they service to create a taxing district, but due to the size of the district, no election is needed.

At 10:46 a.m., the Commission recessed for the County Park Board meeting.

A motion to approve the agenda was made by Taylor, seconded by Hansen. Motion carried.

A motion to approve the March 2025 meeting minutes was made by Mooridian, seconded by Hastings. Unanimous aye vote.

Kenneth Pfarr, Burns & McDonnell presented a request on behalf of WBI Energy to access Park Board land to do surveys for an upcoming MDU pipeline project from Williston to Fargo. A motion to allow Burns & McDonnell on behalf of WBI Energy, to do the survey using foot traffic only and with no land disruption was made by Mooridian, seconded by Bergquist. Roll call vote: Hastings, Wolsky, Taylor, Bergquist, Mooridian, Hansen, voted aye. Motion carried.

Alonge provided an update on West Lakeside Road ownership for the Midco fiber optic project. The Bureau put the road in specifically for cabin access, so the Park Board would be the authority for the permit.

A motion to approve the monthly bills was made by Hastings, seconded by Wolsky. Roll call vote: Wolsky, Taylor, Bergquist, Mooridian, and Hansen voted aye. Motion carried.
