Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission—April 16, 2024

At 3:30 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Jerry Bergquist, Chad Wolsky, Mark Klose, Levi Taylor, and Joan Morris answered the roll call.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Jessica Alonge, Auditor/COO, presented an update on the 2024 election. Alonge reminded voters to ensure their ID is up to date with their current address. Alonge stated that absentee ballot applications are available at the auditor's office or at vote.nd.gov. Alonge also presented a book received from the National Association of Counties, Alonge recommended donating the books to the library.

Maureen McGilvrey, Treasurer/Recorder, requested a promotion for Deputy Recorder Tyler Jager, based on completion of the requirements of the promotion policy. motion to approve the promotion with the pay raise effective May 1, 2024 was made by Morris, seconded by Bergquist. Roll call vote: Bergquist, Wolsky, Morris, Taylor, and Klose voted aye. Motion carried.

Jim Wentland, Road Superintendent, presented an update for the Chase Lake Township road. Wentland stated that he has talked to Jennifer Hewitt at the Fish & Wildlife department and was told they are applying for federal funding to fix and maintain the road.

Wentland received two bids for chip sealing. Aztec bid \$644,127.14 and Morris Seal Company bid \$487,251.72. Wentland requested to award the chip seal bid to Morris Seal Company. A motion to award the bid was made by Wolsky, seconded by Taylor. Roll call vote: Wolsky, Morris, Taylor, Klose, and Bergquist voted aye. Motion carried.

Wentland requested to award the Motor Grader Bid to RDO for \$373,200 with trade-in, and \$497,000 without. A motion to approve the purchase with or without trade was made by Taylor, seconded by Wolsky. Roll call vote: Morris, Taylor, Klose, Bergquist, and Wolsky voted aye. Motion carried.

Chad Kaiser, Sheriff, requested permission to accept a flooring quote from Hillerud Construction for \$11,480. A motion to approve the flooring quote was made by Wolsky seconded by Bergquist. Roll call vote: Taylor, Klose, Bergquist, Wolsky, and Morris voted aye. Motion carried.

Alonge proposed the Joint Powers Agreement between Stutsman County and the City of Jamestown for the Law Enforcement Center. The Governing Authority Committee voted at their last meeting to bring the agreement to the County Commission and City Council for approval. Bergquist made a motion to approve the revised Joint Powers Agreement, seconded by Taylor. Klose clarified that the agreement stated Stutsman County as the owner of the Law Enforcement Center. Morris questioned the billing process for the LEC between the City and County. Alonge stated that the County pays for expenses and is reimbursed annually by the City. Bergquist stated that the agreement contains an automatic renewal or revision every 2 years, with the City and

County reviewing budgets on an annual basis. Roll call vote: Klose, Bergquist, Wolsky, Morris, and Taylor voted aye. Motion carried.

Alonge requested the appointment of 2024 primary election workers. A motion to approve the workers was made by Morris, seconded by Bergquist. Roll call vote: Bergquist, Wolsky, Morris, Taylor, and Klose voted aye. Motion carried.

Alonge presented the 2024 Greshik Spiritwood Farmland Lease. A motion to revise the price to \$70 per acre and renew the 2024 lease for one year was made by Bergquist, seconded by Wolsky. Roll call vote: Wolsky, Morris, Taylor, Klose, and Bergquist voted aye. Motion carried.

At 4:30 p.m., the Commission meeting recessed for the Park Board meeting.

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Park Board – April 16, 2024

At 4:31 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Park Board to order. Jerry Bergquist, Mark Klose, Chad Wolsky, Joan Morris, Levi Taylor, Henry Steinberger answered the roll call. Merri Mooridian was present via phone.

Karl Bergh, Park Superintendent, presented an update on park board weed control options. Bergh stated he would have his employee get certified for ornamental spraying, which would only cover the low-grade areas. It is \$115 for the employee to get certified.

Jerry Bergquist, County Commissioner brought forth a discussion for the Park Department's Master Plan. Bergquist stated that the most recent Master Plan was created by the Bureau of Reclamation in 2004 and is now outdated and does not encompass all park board lands, only lands that were once owned by the bureau. Bergquist stated it would be beneficial to work with Jamestown Parks and Recreation and to use their process of creating a Master Plan as an example for the creating the County's. Amy Walters, Executive Director, Jamestown Parks and Recreation, presented the process of developing Jamestown Parks & Recreation's Master Plan for reaching short and long-term goals. Bergquist suggested to have the Park Board Portfolio to review Jamestown Parks & Recreation's Master Plan and adapt it in a similar manner for the Park Board's Master Plan. Walters stated that this plan is set in place for 10 years at a time.

A motion to approve the mid-month bills was made by Bergquist, seconded by Steinberger. Roll call vote: Morris, Taylor, Klose, Steinberger, Mooridian, Bergquist, and Wolsky voted aye. Motion carried.
