

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission—May 2, 2023

At 3:30 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Jerry Bergquist, Chad Wolsky, Joan Morris, Steven Cichos, and Mark Klose answered the roll call.

A motion was made by Cichos to approve the April 2023 meeting minutes, seconded by Bergquist. Motion carried.

Levi Taylor, Manns Township Supervisor, presented concerns for County Road 62. Taylor asked if there was anything that the township officers could do to assist the board to begin work on the road's conditions. Morris reminded Taylor that JSDC has been working on a plan for roads critical condition. No action was taken.

Andrew Kirking, Emergency Manager, presented updates on the Governor's Snow Removal Bill. The county share of the \$268,000 total snow removal cost is \$144,000. Kirking anticipates up to \$66,594 in reimbursements. The state has requested preliminary flood damage and up to \$100,000 worth of damage is needed to qualify for the FEMA declaration.

Jim Fettig, Maintenance Supervisor, requested to replace the gutter and curb in front of the courthouse and to add additional sidewalk outside of the courthouse. Fettig presented a bid from LD Concrete for the gutter, curb, and sidewalk for \$8,617.00 which is slightly over budget. Fettig has additional funds in the maintenance budget to cover the excess. Cichos asked whether ARPA funds could be used to cover the excess. A motion to approve the project, with funding to be determined, was made by Cichos, seconded by Wolsky. Roll call vote: Bergquist, Wolsky, Morris, Cichos, and Klose voted aye. Motion carried.

Fritz Fremgen, State's Attorney, presented his monthly report.

Jim Wentland, Road Superintendent, requested approval to order a Speed Plow set for purchase in 2024. The plow would not be received or paid for until 2024. Wentland has \$230,000 budgeted for the purchase and received a bid for \$311,000. He would like to use fund balance and replenish the difference over the next year or two. A motion to approve placing the order was made by Wolsky, seconded by Bergquist. Roll call vote: Wolsky, Morris, Cichos, Klose, and Bergquist voted aye. Motion carried.

Wentland requested approval to award the engineering contract for the bridge replacement at the Reservoir to Interstate Engineering. A motion to award the bid to Interstate Engineering was made by Bergquist, seconded by Cichos. Motion carried.

A motion to renew the Greshik 2023 Spiritwood Farmland Lease at the same amount per acre for one year was made by Cichos, seconded by Wolsky. Roll call vote: Morris, Cichos, Klose, Bergquist, and Wolsky voted aye. Motion carried.

The board discussed adding the opportunity to say the Pledge of Allegiance at the beginning of each commission meeting and agenda.

At 4:09 P.M., the Commission recessed for the County Park Board meeting.

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Park Board – May 2, 2023

At 4:11 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Park Board to order. Jerry Bergquist, Chad Wolsky, Joan Morris, Steven Cichos, Mark Klose, Robert Martin, and Merri Mooridian (via phone) answered the roll call.

A motion was made by Bergquist to approve the April 2023 meeting minutes, seconded by Morris. Motion carried.

A motion to transfer reservoir grazing lease from Neva to Justin Backer was made by Morris, seconded by Martin. Roll call vote: Cichos, Klose, Martin, Mooridian, Bergquist, Wolsky, and Morris voted aye. Motion carried.

Fremgen presented an issue with the current approved dock permit and revisions he has suggested. Attorney Carvell is currently researching to help the board come to a decision regarding the dock permits related to the language in the agreement with the Bureau of Reclamation. Based on previous action taken by the Park Board, the lessees may not have the right of renewal and could end up losing the right to have a dock this season. The current permit allows for the right of renewal. Fremgen made some changes to remove that clause from the dock permit. Mitch Ostlie, District 12 Representative and Jamestown resident, informed the board that he has had conversations with members of the Bureau of Reclamation that claim to not own the land or set the rules. A motion to send out the revised permit and cover letter was made by Cichos, seconded by Martin. Motion carried. Roll call vote: Klose, Martin, Mooridian, Bergquist, Wolsky, Morris, and Cichos voted aye. Motion carried.

Cichos questioned reimbursement for a bill for Interstate Engineering and Martin questioned reimbursement for utilities for the boat wash stations. The Bureau will reimburse the engineering bill and Game & Fish will reimburse the utilities. A motion to approve payment of the monthly bills was made by Cichos, seconded by Martin. Roll call vote: Martin, Mooridian, Bergquist, Wolsky, Morris, Cichos, and Klose voted aye. Motion carried.

Cichos presented issues regarding broken asphalt in front of Hondo's Hideaway and the condition of the bike path. Cichos asked Karl Bergh, Park Superintendent, if he would be able to get a quote from Border States.

Morris questioned the Daktel project within Lakeside Campground. Bergh will reach out to them for an update.

Martin presented water elevation levels at the Jamestown and Pipestem Dams.

Lucas Dockter, Hondo's Hideaway, asked for permission to create a sublease to provide watercraft rentals at the marina. A motion to approve the sublease was made by Bergquist seconded by Cichos. Mooridian, Bergquist, Wolsky, Morris, Cichos, Klose, Martin voted aye. Motion carried.

Dockter informed the board that he has had many public inquiries for slip rentals. Dockter would like to develop the area between the beach and the public access area and would like to add a passageway and

walking path. A motion to explore his options with costs and solicit the 404 permit was made by Cichos, seconded by Wolsky. Motion carried.

At 4:42 p.m. a motion was made by Morris to adjourn the Park Board meeting, seconded by Martin. Motion carried.

At 4:42 p.m., the Commission meeting was called back to order.

A motion to approve payment of the monthly bills was made by Morris, seconded by Bergquist. Roll call vote: Bergquist, Wolsky, Morris, Cichos, and Klose voted aye. Motion carried.
