Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission—June 4, 2024

At 9:00 a.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Jerry Bergquist, Chad Wolsky, Levi Taylor, Joan Morris, and Mark Klose were present.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Jessica Alonge, Auditor/COO, presented an update on the 2024 election. She reminded voters to ensure their ID is up to date with their current address. Absentee voting opened on May 2<sup>nd</sup>, and absentee ballot applications are available at the auditor's office or vote.nd.gov. Early voting is currently open 8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. through the end of the week. The primary election is June 11<sup>th</sup>, from 7:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m. The Jamestown Civic Center is the polling location for any precinct in the county and the Medina American Legion is a polling location for precinct 472910 only.

Klose opened the public hearing for the vacation of the section line in the N1/2 of the S1/2 of Peterson Township. Johanna Benker, the owner of the adjacent property in section 30, joined the meeting via telephone. Benker is against the vacation of the section line. Bergquist, Morris, and Jim Wentland, Road Superintendent, visited the property. The living snow fence was already planted by Allen Kleven. There is a fence going east/west that is not connected to anything but is blocking any traffic from gaining access to the section line. A motion to decline the vacation of the section line, and for the removal of the trees and the fence blocking the section line was made by Taylor, seconded by Bergquist. Roll call vote: Bergquist, Wolsky, Morris, Taylor, and Klose voted aye. Motion carried.

A motion to approve the May 2024 meeting minutes was made by Morris, seconded by Taylor. Unanimous aye vote. Motion carried.

Ryan Gellner, NDACo Vision Zero Outreach Program Manager, requested support for a vision zero regional coordinator position in Stutsman County. The position is a full-time, grant-based position that is 100% reimbursed. This position would serve a 10-county region. Sheriff Chad Kaiser would be the onsite supervisor, but day to day operations would be supervised by Gellner. The only thing provided by the county would be office space. A motion to enter into the agreement with NDACo was made by Wolsky, seconded by Bergquist. Roll call vote: Wolsky, Morris, Taylor, Klose, and Bergquist voted aye. Motion carried.

Klose presented years of service awards to employees in various departments. The awards were presented to employees for five and ten years of service.

Shannon Davis, HR Director, presented various openings on county boards. County Coroner Larry Johnson is seeking reappointment and has been coroner since 1985. A motion to approve Johnson as county coroner was made by Bergquist, seconded by Morris. Unanimous aye vote. Motion carried.

Jane Trautman applied for reappointment for the county position on the City of Jamestown Planning Commission for a 5-year term. A motion to approve Trautman was made by Morris, seconded by Wolsky. Unanimous aye vote. Motion carried.

The Housing Authority Board has 1 position for a 5-year term in which Tonya Perkins is seeking reappointment. A motion to approve was made by Bergquist, seconded by Taylor. Unanimous aye vote. Motion carried.

The Stutsman County Zoning Board currently has 3 open positions. Two applications were received from Duane Andersen & Brian Amundson who are both seeking reappointment for the 4-year term. The position will need to be re-advertised to fill the third opening. A motion to approve Andersen and Amundson was made by Morris, seconded by Wolsky. Unanimous aye vote. Motion carried.

There is one position open on the library board and two applications were received. Pam Phillips is seeking reappointment, and Martin Connard Toepke Floyd is seeking appointment. A motion to readvertise the position for another 30 days was made by Taylor, seconded by Morris. Unanimous aye vote. Motion carried.

A high school student reached out to Andrew Kirking, Emergency Manager, regarding job shadowing in dispatch for potential future employment. Several other counties have this type of program. Davis would put together a program for this student as a trial and then in the fall present the job shadow program to the commission in hopes of opening up the program to other county departments. A motion to allow the job shadow program in dispatch, as a pilot, in dispatch was made by Berquist, seconded by Wolsky. Unanimous aye vote. Motion carried.

Mark Attleson, Maintenance Supervisor, presented a request to purchase two new heat pumps for the IT room for a total of \$53,450. Alonge informed the board that funding would come from various budget areas. The courthouse maintenance budget sets aside \$15,000 per year for heat pumps, and the LEC maintenance budget has \$24,800 for heat pump replacement. There is still \$38,025 remaining in the ARPA fund for heat pumps that was preapproved. A motion to approve the purchase of 2 heat pumps and pay for the installation of 8 heat pumps, not to exceed the \$78,000 budgeted was made by Morris, seconded by Bergquist. Roll call vote: Morris, Taylor, Klose, Bergquist, and Wolsky voted aye.

Attleson also requested to purchase a new dishwasher for the jail. The request is for just under \$16,000 and was originally budgeted for \$22,000. A motion to approve the dishwasher and pay the associated installation costs was made by Taylor, seconded by Wolsky. Roll call: Taylor, Klose, Bergquist, Wolsky, and Morris voted aye.

A washing machine replacement is also needed in the jail. The replacement cost is \$6,670. A motion to approve the purchase of the machine, plus freight charges was made by Bergquist, seconded by Morris. Roll call vote: Klose, Bergquist, Wolsky, Morris, and Taylor voted aye. Motion carried.

Attleson received quotes for a new lawnmower with a plow, snowblower, and bagging system in the amount of \$32,649.40 with trade in of the current mower. A motion to approve the purchase and allow the trade in was made by Taylor, seconded by Morris. Roll call vote: Bergquist, Wolsky, Morris, Taylor, and Klose voted aye.

Next, Attleson presented the quote for the concrete project for the LEC and generator. There will be 40' done on the east side for the generator, and there is a 40'x60' area remaining that also needs to be redone. Attleson received a quote from Lux for \$44,450. There is currently \$35,000 in the concrete replacement capital budget. A motion to approve was made by Bergquist, seconded by Wolsky. Roll call vote: Wolsky, Morris, Taylor, Klose, and Bergquist voted aye. Motion carried.

Wolsky suggested closing nonessential county offices on July 5<sup>th</sup> to show appreciation to employees. A motion to approve the July 5<sup>th</sup> closure was made by Taylor, seconded by Bergquist. Unanimous aye vote.

Alonge presented an updated list of 2024 primary election workers and canvassing board members. A motion to approve the updated list as presented was made by Morris, seconded by Taylor. Roll call vote: Morris, Taylor, Klose, Bergquist, and Wolsky voted aye.

Alonge reminded Klose that he must sit on the canvass board at 10:00 a.m. on June 24<sup>th</sup>, 2024.

Alonge presented 2024 budget transfers on behalf of the weed board and the drug task force. The weed board authorized the transfer of \$200,000 from their regular fund to their capital fund. The drug task force requested to transfer \$100,000 to the sheriff's capital fund for reimbursement of prior years' expenses. A motion to approve both 2024 budget transfers was made by Bergquist, seconded by Taylor. Roll call vote: Taylor, Klose, Bergquist, Wolsky, and Morris voted aye.

Alonge then requested appointment for members of the Stutsman County Reorganization Committee. Tricia Jungels from the Pingree-Buchanan School District and Alice Pekarski from the Montpelier School District have agreed to be on the committee. A meeting has been scheduled for June 19<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 a.m. to review the petition, and the hearing will be held on June 21<sup>st</sup> at 9:00 a.m. hearing.

Kaiser presented an update on the sheriff's building. He will be receiving the keys after the electrical inspection is complete. Kaiser is requesting to finish a 25' x 100' concrete portion on the North side of the building to help with water. He received a quote from Lux for \$32,500. The request will be tabled until Kaiser obtains additional quotes.

A motion to purchase a floor scrubber for \$3,900 for the sheriff's building was made by Wolsky, seconded by Bergquist. Roll call vote: Klose, Bergquist, Wolsky, Morris, and Taylor voted aye. Motion carried.

A motion to approve firework sales applications for PHAntom Pyroshack & Crew Fireworks was made by Taylor, seconded by Morris. Unanimous aye vote. Motion carried.

At 10:48 a.m., the Commission recessed for the County Park Board meeting.

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Park Board— June 4, 2024

At 10:48 a.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Park Board to order. Jerry Bergquist, Chad Wolsky, Levi Taylor, Mark Klose, Joan Morris, Henry Steinberger, and Merri Mooridian (via telephone) answered the roll call.

A motion to approve the May 2024 meeting minutes was made by Bergquist, seconded by Steinberger. Unanimous aye vote. Motion carried.

Karl Bergh, Park Superintendent requested to begin the 2024 budgeted capital project of adding the additional tank at Hondo's. He would also like to change the bathhouse to rural water. \$15,000 was budgeted for the project. A motion to approve the upgrades to the bathhouse and water line, including abandoning the old well, not to exceed \$15,000, was made by Taylor, seconded by Wolsky. Roll call vote: Steinberger, Mooridian, Bergquist, Wolsky, Morris, Taylor, and Klose voted aye.

Next, Bergh requested to purchase a new mower in the amount of \$89,000. The park portfolio recommended purchasing the mower, not leasing it. He was offered \$10,000 for trade in of the old mower. The new mower is one year out. A motion to order the new mower for delivery and payment in

2025 was made by Bergquist, seconded by Mooridian. Roll call vote: Mooridian, Bergquist, Wolsky, Morris, Taylor, Klose, and Steinberger voted aye. Motion carried.

Bergh requested to add a primitive group camp site for the 2024 season at the boat club to the online reservation system. There is room for 8-10 campers. Rural water is 300' away and would run \$16,000 - \$20,000. Electricity quotes have not yet been returned. A motion to move forward purchasing a sign for primitive camping, not to exceed \$400, with the camping fee set at \$150 for the weekend, Friday - Sunday, and \$50 per night for individual nights, was made by Taylor, seconded by Steinberger. Roll call vote: Bergquist, Wolsky, Morris, Taylor, Klose, Steinberger, and Mooridian voted aye. Motion carried.

Bergh requested permission to re-hire the same individual for mowing the Ypsilanti Park for the 2024 season, at the same rate of \$700 for the year. The park is in very bad condition due to all of the rain this year, and there are several sink holes. A motion to allow the mowing at a rate of \$700 was made by Morris, seconded by Bergquist. Roll call vote: Wolsky, Morris, Taylor, Klose, Steinberger, Mooridian, and Bergquist voted aye. Motion carried.

A discussion was held on administering donated funds in association with the anticipated water trail grant. Steinberger suggested reaching out to Amy Walters with Jamestown Parks & Recreation. He will work on getting donations for the remaining \$20,000 that is needed. Morris requested that the pledges be made before approving the grant itself.

A motion to approve the monthly park bills was made by Wolsky, seconded by Mooridian. Roll call vote: Morris, Taylor, Klose, Steinberger, Mooridian, Bergquist and Wolsky voted aye. Motion carried.
