

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission— June 18, 2024

At 9:00 a.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Jerry Bergquist, Chad Wolsky, Joan Morris, Levi Taylor, and Mark Klose were present.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Jessica Alonge, Auditor/COO, presented election updates and reminders. She reminded voters about address updates. Unofficial results for the 2024 primary election can be found at vote.nd.gov. The canvass board meets on June 24th at 10:00 a.m. and results will be certified after that meeting.

PJ Ringdahl, Jamestown Area Ambulance, presented the 2025 Agency Request in the amount of \$19,951. There were 2,437 calls for service in 2023, with 66% of those being emergency calls. Jamestown Ambulance did implement an 11% salary increase for their staff in 2024. No decision was made by the board, but the request will be considered during the budgeting process.

Katie Hemmer, Jamestown Regional Airport Director, requested to finalize the 2024 loan for airport construction. She is requesting an additional \$275,000, interest free, with a ten-year amortization schedule, to be paid back through the airport levy. A motion to approve the request was made by Morris, seconded by Wolsky. Roll call vote: Bergquist, Wolsky, Morris, Taylor, and Klose voted aye. Motion carried.

Shannon Davis, Human Resource Director, presented the request to fill an unexpired term on the Central Valley Health District Board. Brienne Huber, family physician at Sanford Health applied for appointment. A motion to appoint Huber was made by Bergquist, seconded by Taylor. Unanimous aye vote. Motion carried.

Chad Kaiser, Sheriff, presented quotes for finishing the concrete at the new building. He received bids from Lux, Building Professionals, and McGruder Construction. His request is to do a 25' x 100' slab with McGruder Construction, the lowest bidder, in the amount of \$20,000. A motion to accept the bid from McGruder was made by Wolsky, seconded by Taylor. Roll call vote: Wolsky, Morris, Taylor, Klose, and Bergquist voted aye. Motion carried.

Jim Wentland, Road Superintendent, presented a right of way appraisal for the Ypsilanti bridge project. He is requesting to purchase the land around the Ypsilanti bridge in the appraisal amount of \$6,500 per acre. Daren Peterka, Interstate Engineering, spoke on the project. The funding for the bridge replacement would be 100% with a cap of \$1.25 million but will not cover the purchase of the right of way. A motion to accept the appraisal value for the replacement of the bridge was made by Bergquist, seconded by Taylor. Roll call vote: Morris, Taylor, Klose, Bergquist, and Wolsky voted aye. Motion carried.

Wentland received an email from BNSF about co-oping the bridge project for the 94th Avenue Railroad Crossing, requesting a 50/50 split for the railway crossing. The project has already started, and there has been no correspondence from Wentland. The request will be tabled until the July 2nd commission meeting.

Next, Wentland requested to award the 2024 crushing bid. He received bids from RTS at \$4.07 per cubic yard and Tony Scepaniak at \$4.09 per cubic yard. A motion to award the 2024 crushing bid to Tony Scepaniak was made by Taylor, seconded by Morris. Roll call vote: Taylor, Klose, Bergquist, Wolsky, and Morris voted aye. Motion carried.

Alonge informed the board of the openings in NDCCAA committees. There are openings in the audit, nominating, resolution and legislative committees.

Alonge also presented an update on the Peterson Township section line. She has been in contact with Allen Kleven since the last meeting regarding the removal of the trees. A motion to send a letter, giving 30 days for the removal of the trees and fence, with the option of accommodations if the deadline is unmeetable, which must be corresponded with the commission prior to the deadline, was made by Taylor, seconded by Bergquist. Unanimous aye vote. Motion carried.

Alonge informed the board that all five members of the Stutsman County reorganizational committee have been appointed. Bruce Schlecht, Medina, Bob Toso, Alice Pekarski, Montpelier, Terry Schwartz and Tricia Jungels, Pingree/Buchanan, agreed to be members. There is a meeting to review the petition on June 19th, and the hearing will be held June 21st. The final decision is made by the state.

A motion to approve the fireworks application for Memory Fireworks was made by Morris, seconded by Taylor. Unanimous aye vote. Motion carried.

At 9:53 a.m., the Commission recessed for the County Park Board meeting.

A motion to approve the mid-month park bills was made by Mooridian, seconded by Bergquist. Roll call vote: Klose, Mooridian, Bergquist, Wolsky, Morris, and Taylor voted aye. Motion carried.
