

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Park Board— August 5, 2025

At 8:30 a.m., Chairman Taylor called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Park Board to order. Ben Tompkins, Mike Hansen, Chad Wolsky, Levi Taylor, and Merri Mooridian, answered roll. Amanda Hastings joined via Teams, but had technical difficulties. Henry Steinberger was absent.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

No public comments were presented.

A motion to approve the agenda was made by Wolsky, seconded by Tompkins. Unanimous aye vote. Motion carried.

A motion to approve the July 2025 meeting minutes was made by Tompkins, seconded by Mooridian. Unanimous aye vote. Motion carried.

Rob & Leah Brooks requested a permit to run Spiritwood Resort. They are requesting a twenty-five-year permit. Jessica Alonge, Auditor/COO, has been in touch with their banker and attorney regarding the permit. Fritz Fremgen, State's Attorney, has a concern with the consent to collateral document presented by the bank. The language transfers the permit to the bank, not to the concessionaires. The park portfolio will look at the agreement to find language that will work for both the county and the buyers. Eric Nordstrom, current owner of Spiritwood Resort, requested a time frame for the process. A motion to table the proposed permit and the request for collateral assignment agreement until the August 19 meeting was made by Tompkins, seconded by Wolsky. Unanimous aye vote. Motion carried.

A motion to approve the monthly bills was made by Tompkins, seconded by Mooridian. Roll call vote: Tompkins, Hansen, Wolsky, Taylor, and Mooridian voted aye. Motion carried.

At 8:52 a.m., a motion to adjourn the county park board meeting was made by Mooridian, seconded by Tompkins. Motion carried.

A ten-minute recess was held.

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission— August 5, 2025

At 9:03 a.m., Chairman Taylor called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Ben Tompkins, Mike Hansen, Amanda Hastings (via Teams), Chad Wolsky, and Levi Taylor answered the roll call.

No public comments were presented.

A motion to approve the agenda was made by Wolsky, seconded by Tompkins. Motion carried.

A motion to approve the July 2025 meeting minutes was made by Tompkins, seconded by Wolsky. Unanimous aye vote. Motion carried.

Taylor presented the June and July years of service awards to Brant Mickelson (5), Brian Davis (10), Mark Attleson (10), David Bratton (10), Scott Cebula (20) and Jessica Hartman (20).

Roger Shaffer, Sinclair Township, expressed his concerns with the culvert that was installed four miles south of Cleveland. The water is flowing toward his property, flooding his farm. He is working with Mike May, Interstate Engineering, and Jesse Christianson, Highway Superintendent, to find an outlet for the water. He praised Christianson for his hard work as Highway Superintendent. Christianson gave some background on the area. The water was impeding on the road 2 miles south, and a 30-inch culvert was installed. Moving the water will take time and money to complete.

Dorene Stroh, City of Jamestown Assessor, presented thirteen wheelchair abatements dating back from 2023, due to a change in legislation that was missed. The amount of the exemption changed from \$100,000 to \$150,000. A motion to approve the abatements was made by Tompkins, seconded by Hansen. Roll call vote: Hansen, Hastings, Wolsky, Taylor, and Tompkins voted aye. Motion carried.

Sue Koropatnicki, Treasurer/Recorder, introduced Tonya Drenth, Deputy Treasurer and requested to change the signing authority on the county bank and investment accounts. If approved, the signers would be Sue Koropatnicki, Treasurer/Recorder, Jessica Alonge, Auditor/COO, Tonya Drenth, Deputy Treasurer, and Tyler Jager, Deputy Recorder. A motion to approve the changes in signing authority was made by Wolsky, seconded by Tompkins. Roll call vote: Hastings, Wolsky, Taylor, Tompkins, and Hastings voted aye. Motion carried.

Fremgen presented his monthly report. He recommended and requested opting into two opioid class action suits against Purdue/Sackler and Alvogen Zydus et al. The monies awarded for the settlements are forwarded to Central Valley Health. A motion to opt in to the class action suits was made by Tompkins, seconded by Hansen. Unanimous aye vote. Motion carried.

Christianson and Hansen met with a Kidder County Commissioner to come up with an agreement for the maintenance of Crystal Springs Road. There were previous agreements in place, but they could not find any written agreement. A motion to approve the agreement for two years was made by Hansen, seconded by Tompkins. Roll call vote: Wolsky, Taylor, Tompkins, Hansen, and Hastings voted aye. Motion carried.

Christianson then presented a request to purchase a semi in the amount of \$30,000 with insurance money from the two that were damaged in the storm, if one becomes available. Christianson will get some

information on what it will cost to repair the damaged semis. A motion to approve the buyback of the two damaged semis from the insurance company was made by Wolsky, seconded by Hansen. Roll call vote: Taylor, Tompkins, Hansen, Hastings, and Wolsky voted aye. Motion carried.

Next, Christianson presented changes to the LoadPass permit agreement with townships. The terms of the agreement will need to be edited to add the 10% prior to adoption by the Commission. Three townships have shown interest in the program.

Taylor has been in contact with Dave Schwartz, former Commissioner, requesting that he serve as a consultant for the road department and commission based on his knowledge and experience with the county road system and funding. The proposed agreement would commence July 15, 2025 and continue for a period of one year, at which time it could be revisited. The consulting rate would be set at \$35 per hour, and mileage would be reimbursed. would be willing to serve in that capacity consulting fee and would also be reimbursed for his mileage. A motion to enter into an agreement with Schwartz to act as a consultant as presented was made by Tompkins, seconded by Taylor. Roll call vote: Tompkins, Hansen, Wolsky, and Taylor voted aye. Motion carried. Due to technical difficulties, Hastings vote could not be heard.

Christianson found a 2006 D6N Dozer available from Trautman Farms, a private seller, that he would like to purchase. The D6 is listed at \$60,000. Trautman Farms would like to give the department a trade in value of \$10,000 for their D7 Dozer, and \$10,000 for the military scraper, leaving the actual cost of the D6 by the county at \$40,000. A motion to approve the trade and purchase was made by Tompkins, seconded by Wolsky. Roll call vote: Hansen, Hastings, Wolsky, Taylor, and Tompkins voted aye. Motion carried.

Alonge presented information on the NDACo Delegate to be appointed each odd numbered year. A motion to appoint Alonge as the NDACo delegate was made by Tompkins, seconded by Wolsky. Unanimous aye vote. Motion carried.

Alonge also requested the budget hearing be scheduled for October 7, 2025, at 6:00 p.m. and the times for the regularly scheduled Park Board and Commission meetings be adjusted to an afternoon start time to reduce travel time for Board members. The times for the regular meetings can be set closer to the October date, based on the agenda. A motion to approve was made by Hastings, seconded by Taylor. Unanimous aye vote. Motion carried.

A preliminary budget discussion was held. Alonge informed the board that due to changes in legislation, all taxing districts must hold a budget hearing and must notify the auditor's office of their budget hearing date, time and location by August 10, 2025. If they fail to notify the auditor's office by that date, the district cannot levy more in dollars than the previous year. Alonge presented a sample notice of budget hearing that will replace the estimated tax notices. Alonge explained the 3% cap calculation factors in new growth, and that water management and the emergency fund are exempt from the cap. She will set up meetings with board members to explain the budgeting process since for many this is their first budget season.

Alonge presented an asset forfeiture fund application and requested immediate payment of the funds. The request is for payment of \$197 to the special prosecutor of the case. A motion to approve was made

by Tompkins, second by Wolsky. Roll call vote: Hastings, Wolsky, Taylor, Tompkins, and Hansen voted aye. Motion carried.

A motion to approve the monthly bills was made by Hansen, seconded by Tompkins. Roll call vote: Wolsky, Taylor, Tompkins, Hansen, and Hastings voted aye. Motion carried.
