Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission—October 7, 2025

At 3:37 p.m., Chairman Taylor called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Ben Tompkins, Mike Hansen, Amanda Hastings, Chad Wolsky (via telephone), and Levi Taylor answered roll.

No public comments were presented.

A motion to approve the agenda was made by Hastings, seconded by Tompkins. Motion carried.

A motion to approve the September 2025 meeting minutes was made by Hansen, seconded by Tompkins. Unanimous aye vote. Motion carried.

At 3:39 p.m., the county Commission meeting recessed to return to the Park Board meeting.

At 3:40 p.m., the Park Board meeting was called back to order.

Steve Cameron, WBI Energy, requested a reroute for survey access to the parcel north of the already approved access area. A motion to amend the original agreement to approve access to the additional parcel was made by Tompkins, seconded by Hansen. Unanimous aye vote. Motion carried.

At 3:44 p.m., a motion to re-adjourn the Park Board meeting was made by Tompkins, seconded by Hansen. Unanimous aye vote. Motion carried.

At 3:45 p.m., Taylor called the Commission meeting back to order.

Fritz Fremgen, State's Attorney, presented his monthly report. The Victim/Witness Advocate position is still vacant.

At 3:48 p.m., Wolsky exited the meeting.

At 3:49 p.m., Wolsky rejoined the meeting

Jesse Christianson, Highway Superintendent, requested permission to advertise for bids for the purchase of two blades for 2026. A motion to allow for the advertisement of bids was made by Hastings, seconded by Tompkins. Unanimous aye vote. Motion carried.

Jessica Alonge, Auditor/COO, stated that the opening of the motor grader bids will be at 8:45 a.m., on October 31st, and a special Commission meeting will be held following the opening, at 9:00 a.m. to award the bid. This will avoid any price changes that would happen in November.

Hastings volunteered to act as the ND State Fair Delegate, to attend the annual meeting in Minot on November 18th. A motion to appoint Hastings was made by Tompkins, seconded by Taylor. Motion carried.

Alonge presented the MOU from the Secretary of State for the election equipment. The equipment is owned and maintained by the state and used and stored by the county. A motion to approve the MOU was made by Hastings, seconded by Tompkins. Unanimous aye vote. Motion carried.

Next, Alonge presented the list of current foreclosure properties that have been transferred into the counties' name for delinquent real estate taxes. The properties will need to be appraised in order to set a minimum sales price for the November 18th sale. Hastings will appraise the City of Jamestown and Midway

Township parcels, Tomkins will take the Streeter and Medina parcels, Taylor will do the Cleveland and Winfield Township parcels, and Wolsky will take the parcel in Moon Lake Township. The appraisal amounts will be returned to the Auditor's Office no later than October 16th.

The foreclosure sale will be held on November 18^{th} at 10:00 a.m. The Park Board and Commission meetings scheduled for that day will be held from 8:30 a.m. -9:30 a.m., with any items not discussed within that hour being tabled to the next meeting.

Alonge presented a revenue and expense update for the Crystal Springs project. The expenses so far total \$248,771.50, with total donations received of \$81,000. The Commission previously allocated \$42,100 from the local tribal consistency fund and a reimbursement request to the State Water Commission was submitted in the amount of \$81,364.16. The total cost share approved by the state is \$117,900. The amount over the donations and prior allocation by the County to date \$7,771.50.

Michael Gunsch, Houston Engineering presented an update on the Crystal Springs Watershed Feasibility Study. A public information meeting will be held in October, either the 15th or 17th at the Pfifer Auction Building in Steele, to discuss the Kidder County concerns and answer any questions they may have. Gunsch will send Alonge an update of the steering committee contact list.

The NDACo annual conference online registration deadline is Friday.

The 2026 budget was discussed. There were several abatements approved recently, both city and county, that reduced the taxable value to \$154,957 per mill. An unused cap amount of \$535,402 or approximately 4.76% remains. The max amount allowed to be carried over is 3% or \$337,398.

A motion to approve the monthly bills was made by Hastings, seconded by Tompkins. Roll call vote: Hansen, Hastings, Wolsky, Taylor, and Tompkins voted aye. Motion carried.
