

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission - October 17, 2017

At 4:30 p.m., Chairman Klose called the meeting to order. Dale Marks, Denny Ova, Mark Klose, and Craig Neys answered the roll call. Absent was Dave Schwartz.

Nicole Meland, Interim Auditor/COO discussed the appraisal values for the Tax Foreclosure Properties that the commissioners set. This amount will be the minimum opening bid for the properties at the tax sale on November 21<sup>st</sup>. Some properties were assessed below the amount currently owed to the County in taxes. Approval is needed if the starting bid is below the tax owed. Marks made a motion to leave the values as the commissioners appraised them, seconded by Neys. Neys, Klose, Ova, and Marks voted aye. Motion carried.

Meland discussed the James River Clean-up Community Development Block Grant from the Governor's office. Meland received an email from John Grabinger offering a \$150,000 match grant instead of the \$50,000 that was discussed at the last commission meeting. This grant would need to be matched by the County or another entity, and the state needs a decision by Wednesday, October 18. The terms of the grant were not clear in the email from the State. Joan Morris, member of the Stutsman County Water Board task force for the James River clean-up clarified that this is an emergency grant that is good for one year from the date of approval, but could be extended another six months if there are extenuating circumstances. Chairman Klose voiced concerns about the time crunch of the grant, the lack of time to discuss the details of the project, as well as budget concerns. Morris said that the grant would be administered by the South Central Dakota Regional Council (SCDRC), who would receive invoices and request funds from the County and the State. Katie Anderson, Jamestown City Mayor, said that the city council would have to approve any involvement in the project, and the budget is a concern for them as well. Stacy Bowerman, Executive Director of SCDRC, said that the matching funds would be requested as bills become due, and would not be needed up front. It was recommended by Morris that there be an initial statement of interest for the \$150,000 from the County so that we do not lose the opportunity for funding, which would then give time for the City of Jamestown and the County to meet and figure out a plan. A motion was made by Ova, to approve being the flow-through entity for the Community Development Block Grant of \$150,000, seconded by Marks. Motion carried.

Jerry Bergquist, Emergency Manager/911 Coordinator discussed the Homeland Security Grant that would allow the County to hire a vendor to put on two classes that are required for the department. The grant is for \$20,000. Ova made a motion to accept the grant, seconded by Marks. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Neys, seconded by Ova to approve the taxable meals and mid-month bills. Klose, Ova, Marks, and Neys voted aye. Motion carried.
