

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission – November 13, 2018

At 4:00 p.m., Chairman Mark Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Dale Marks, David Schwartz, Craig Neys, and Mark Klose answered the roll call. Dennis Ova joined by telephone.

Approval of the October meeting minutes was tabled until the next meeting.

Jerry Bergquist, Emergency Manager/9-1-1 Coordinator, discussed the resolution to increase the 9-1-1 fees. The vote for the fee increase passed with 4,855 yes votes to 4,480 no votes. The Commission needs to approve the resolution before a notice can be sent to the phone companies. Schwartz made a motion to approve the resolution to increase the 9-1-1 fee from \$1.00 to \$1.50, seconded by Marks. Ova, Marks, Schwartz, Neys, and Klose voted aye. Motion carried.

Nicole Meland, Auditor/COO, presented the Juvenile Detention Contract with the Department of Corrections. This contract is renewed every 30 months and there were no changes from the previous contract. Ova made a motion to approve the contract, seconded by Marks. Marks, Schwartz, Neys, Klose, and Ova voted aye.

Meland also discussed the Employee Assistance Program contract with the Village. This is a three-year contract and is up for renewal. It can be terminated at any time with 30 days notice. It is \$30 per year for each full-time employee and provides counseling benefits and training for employees. Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Ova to approve the contract. Schwartz, Neys, Klose, Ova, and Marks voted aye. Motion carried.

Meland discussed the Commission meeting scheduled on January 1<sup>st</sup>. This is a holiday and the offices are closed. This has been tabled until December when new Commissioners take office.

Meland discussed the recount for the Commission race from the General Election. This will take place on November 14<sup>th</sup> starting at 8:00 a.m. The Recount Board will tentatively meet at 4:00 p.m.

Klose discussed a Special Event Permit from the Corner Bar. Schwartz made a motion to approve, seconded by Neys. Motion carried.

Schwartz made a motion to approve the monthly bills, seconded by Neys. Neys, Klose, Ova, Marks, and Schwartz voted aye. Motion carried.

Nicole Meland, Auditor/COO discussed the boat dock fee. The amount has been \$150 in the past and needs to be approved by the board. Houge made a motion, seconded by Schwartz, to keep the fee at \$150. Houge, Woodward, Marks, Schwartz, Neys, and Klose voted aye. Motion carried.

Cabin site permit renewals were presented for lots 2E, 4W, 12W, 19W, 50W, and 52W. Houge made a motion, seconded by Marks, to approve the renewals. Motion carried.

Meland announced that Senator Hoeven will be in town to meet with the Park Board on November 20th at 11:00 a.m. in the LEC meeting rooms.

Mike Kessler from Lakeside Marina discussed the lease of the Marina building and sale of his personal property. There has been no progress in finding a new tenant for the building.

At 4:35 P.M. a motion was made to adjourn the Park Board meeting by Schwartz, seconded by Marks. Motion carried.

At 4:35 p.m. the Stutsman County Commission meeting was called back to order.

At 4:36 p.m., Schwartz made a motion to adjourn the commission meeting, seconded by Marks. Motion carried.
