Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission – November 15, 2016

At 4:36 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to Order. Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, David Schwartz, Craig Neys, and Mark T Klose answered the roll call.

Howie Peuser, LEC Maintenance Supervisor, requested to purchase two new boilers. The current big boiler would be the back-up boiler, if needed. Lunseth Plumbing & Heating Co has a bid of \$90,400.00 for two 700,000 BTU boilers. Grant Mechanical has a bid of \$99,490.00. G & R Controls gave two bids for two different options. The first bid would be \$74,707.00 for two 700,000 BTU boilers or three 500,000 BTU boilers for \$75,911.00. G & R Controls' bills include electrical. Climate Control would cost \$6,235.00. G & R Controls lowest bid is \$82,146.00. The budget for the boilers is \$90,000.00. Schwartz made a motion to accept the low bid from G & R Controls for the three 500,000 BTU boilers and Climate Control, seconded by Neys. Roll call vote: Neys, Schwartz, Neys, Klose, Ova and Marks voted aye. Motion carried.

Fettig and Peuser have been working on getting bids for cooling towers. The original cooling tower that was looked at was a reasonable price, but the more it's looked into the more they realize it's not the cooling tower that would best fit our facility. The extra's Stutsman County needed to make the cooling tower run drove the price up. Fettig and Peuser will continue to look into it more. There's at least a year or two left on the current cooling tower.

Eric Nordstrom voiced some questions regarding Spiritwood Lake Resort. Nordstrom is looking at bringing a trailer in for one of his employees. The City of Spiritwood Lake is considering giving him the authorization to do so. The City of Spiritwood Lake would like to know if Stutsman County had any reservations or any issues. The permit allows for one dwelling, so a modification would have to be made. Nordstrom was informed from the City of Spiritwood that he would need a letter of approval for allowing the campground expansion and allowing the mobile home for his employee, which would go in the mobile home park. Ova made a motion to amend the permit to allow a second caretaker dwelling, seconded by Marks. Motion carried.

The second issue is the expansion of the Spiritwood Lake campground. The expansion would go on the East side of the road, by the entrance, going into the resort.

The City of Spiritwood Lake is in the process of putting in a new zoning district within the city. Shirly Krapp, Auditor of Spiritwood Lake City, spoke about this topic. That zoning district would encompass the words "public park, passive and active". Once that is passed, the City of Spiritwood Lake will be entertaining the motion to re-zone that entire area to Public Park, passive and active.

A motion was made by Schwartz, seconded by Marks to send a letter of support to the City of Spiritwood Lake for allowing the expansion of the campground.

Nicole Meland, Administrative Staff Officer, requested excess mill levies for road payments for Flint and Sharlow Townships. Flint and Sharlow both have delinquent balances with the County for their road work that has been done. Both were sent letters November 3, 2016 stating that if the townships did not pay the delinquent balances there would be a request to the commissioners to levy excess mills. Flint Township has an outstanding balance of \$28,760.90 with \$11,408.55 delinquent for over a year. Sharlow Township has an outstanding balance of \$45,616.64 with \$35,353.48 delinquent for over a year. The request is to put excess levies on both townships not to exceed 36 mills. Currently, both townships requested 18 mills. Ova made a motion to put the excess levies on the townships, seconded by Schwartz. Roll call vote: Neys, Klose, Ova, Marks and Schwartz vote aye. Motion carried.

Casey Bradley, Auditor/COO, presented Linda Chadduck's retirement notification. Linda Chadduck is currently the Deputy Auditor/Recorder for Stutsman County. Chadduck has been with the county for 37 years. Wednesday, November 23, 2016 will be her last day with Stutsman County. The Board has had a succession plan in place that has been followed the past year and a half. Nicole Meland has been training in for that position. A direct recommendation on how to proceed will be given in December.

A request from Bradley to purchase new chairs for the commission room was given. New chairs were purchased throughout the building. The chairs in the commission room are the original chairs from the original building. They are roughly 34 years old. Funding is available for 28 chairs and the 6 chairs around the commissioner's desk for a total of \$14,234.06. The commissioners are content with the current chairs.

Connie Ova, JSDC CEO, requested Stutsman County to assists with the New Jobs Training Fund and New Jobs Training Program with Agri-Cover, Inc. Agri-Cover is going to do an expansion, adding 43 new employees and 58,000 square foot building. The agreement recommendation has been approved by the North Dakota Job Service on November 14, 2016. Marks made a motion, seconded by Ova to assist with the New Jobs Training Fund and Program. Motion carried.

Tyler Perleberg, Tax Director, presented a PILT (Payment in Lieu of Taxes) Request. Perleberg received an application for Agri-Cover. Part of the process of this agreement is putting together a sub-committee consisting of one Commission member, a Midway Township member and a member of the School Board. Neys was appointed to be the Commission member on the sub-committee.

Perleberg contacted Attorney Scott Wagner, who wrote the PILT Agreement for CHS, to see if he was interested in writing this one as well. Wagner said he would write up the agreement. His estimate of cost would be \$2,500.00. Ova made a motion to have Attorney Scott Wagner write up the PILT Agreement for Agri-Cover, seconded by Marks. Roll call vote: Klose, Ova, Marks, Schwartz and Neys vote aye. Motion carried.

Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Marks to approve the mid-month bill and taxable meals. Roll call vote: Ova, Marks, Schwartz, Neys and Klose vote aye. Motion carried.
