Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission—November 15, 2022

At 3:30 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Dennis Ova, Joan Morris, Mark Klose and Steven Cichos (via telephone) answered the roll call. Ramone Gumke was absent.

Darrell Roorda, Stutsman County resident, addressed the commission regarding the gravel portion of County Road 62. He would like to see the commission approach the legislators about assisting with the funding to pave that portion of the road since the entire region will benefit from the Spiritwood Energy Park.

Connie Ova, JSDC CEO, and director of the Spiritwood Energy Park Association has been contacted by some legislators on the issue. The previous DOT commissioner suggested that a group be formed to formulate a plan to make the most direct route to the plant that would benefit everyone, and that route was decided to be County Road 62.

At 3:41 p.m. commissioner Gumke joined the meeting via telephone.

Daren Peterka, Interstate Engineering, said Interstate Engineering has been hired by the North Dakota Soybean Growers to give an estimate on the cost of paving the 12 miles of gravel on 62 and they should have that ready in a month or two.

A motion was made by Morris to encourage JSDC to put together a consortium to review the arterial roads leading to the Spiritwood plant, and more specifically County Road 62, seconded by Ova. Motion carried.

Jessica Alonge, Auditor/COO, requested approval of canvass board appointments. The board will consist of a Democrat and Republican from both District 12 and District 29, Klose, Alonge, and Recorder Maureen McGilvrey. A motion was made to approve by Cichos, seconded by Morris. Motion carried.

Alonge then presented the general election recap. The county paid the entire rental fee for the ramp in Medina. The City of Medina agreed to pay 1/3 of the purchase price of the ramp, but the American Legion was not, so it was only a rental for this election. Cichos would like to make sure that the Medina City Council is aware that this was a one-time payment from the county, and it will be up to them to come up with a permanent solution if they wish to keep Medina as a polling place for future elections.

On election day there were 307 voters in Medina, for a total of 4,552 voters, 1,361 early voters; and 866 absentee ballots were processed on election day. There are 8 going to canvass for signature mismatch, and 15 correctly post-marked absentee ballots were received in the mail since election day, along with 10 set-aside ballots.

At 3:52 p.m., the Commission recessed for the County Park Board meeting.

At 3:52 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Park Board to order. Dennis Ova, Joan Morris, Mark Klose, Robert Martin and Merri Mooridian answered the roll call. Steven Cichos and Ramone Gumke attended via telephone.

The first item of discussion was the remaining cabin lot purchases. Alonge indicated there are still approximately 10 cabin lots that have not sold. The question is if there is a deadline for cabin owners to purchase their lots. The Park Board previously approved that if cabin owners did not buy their lots 3 years from the initial appraisal that a new appraisal would have to be done at the owner's expense to determine the sales price. No action will be taken until Alonge hears back from the Bureau.

Peterka presented the options for the box culvert to replace the bridge to the island. He presented both a sloped end and wingwall option. The grade is a raise of 7 feet. Cichos would like an estimate of what it would cost to raise that entire roadway. A motion was made by Ova to purchase the sloped end box culvert in the amount of \$193,730.00, seconded by Morris. Roll call vote: Ova, Morris, Cichos, Klose, Gumke, Mooridian and Martin voted aye. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Mooridian to approve the mid-month bills, seconded by Ova. Roll call vote: Morris, Cichos, Klose, Gumke, Mooridian, Martin and Ova voted aye. Motion carried.
