

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission – November 19, 2019

At 4:34 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Mark Klose, Dennis Ova, Ramone Gumke, David Schwartz, and Steven Cichos answered the roll call.

A motion to approve the presented special minutes was made by Cichos, seconded by Ova. Motion carried.

Doreen Stroh, City Assessor, requested abatements for reduction in true and full values for parcel #74-4240840, parcel #74-4240880 and parcel #74-3613000. A motion to approve the requested abatements for reduction in value in the amounts of \$62,263; \$5,536; and \$18,900 respectively was made by Cichos, seconded by Ova. Roll call vote: Gumke, Schwartz, Cichos, Klose and Ova voted aye. Motion carried.

Tyler Perleberg, Tax Director, presented an abatement for parcel #25-6000140. Cichos made a motion to deny the abatement and keep the true and full value at \$381,000, seconded by Schwartz. Roll call vote: Schwartz, Cichos, Klose, Ova and Gumke voted aye. Motion carried.

Schwartz made a motion to support the proposal to officially name Alkali Lake for the lake south of Spiritwood Lake, seconded by Gumke. Motion carried.

Jerry Bergquist, Emergency Manager / 9-1-1 Coordinator, presented the road damage assessment summary. Total preliminary damages submitted to the State were \$4,237,365.00 and included damages from the townships, cities and county.

Bergquist presented a request to allow a step increase for up to three staff in the communications center who are not receiving a grade change. The request was made in hopes to retain current staff. Staff have been putting in additional hours due to being understaffed a good portion of the year. Gumke made a motion, seconded by Cichos, to allow the step increase for staff not changing grades. Roll call vote: Cichos, Klose, Ova, Gumke and Schwartz voted aye. Motion carried.

A motion to pay out unused annual leave for an employee in the communications center who was unable to use the time due to being short staffed was made by Schwartz, seconded by Gumke. Roll call vote: Klose, Ova, Gumke, Schwartz and Cichos voted aye. Motion carried.

Gumke made a motion to accept the FY 2018 FEMA Pre-Disaster Mitigation (PDM) Grant, seconded by Ova. Motion carried.

A motion to approve the taxable meals and bills was made by Schwartz, seconded by Gumke. Roll call vote: Ova, Gumke, Schwartz, Cichos and Klose voted aye. Motion carried.
