

## Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission — November 19, 2024

At 1:00 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Jerry Bergquist, Chad Wolsky, Joan Morris, Levi Taylor, and Mark Klose were present.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

A motion to approve the October 2024 meeting minutes was made by Bergquist, seconded by Taylor. Motion carried.

Dorene Stroh, Jamestown City Assessor, presented an abatement application for parcel 74-3375460 and recommended reducing the property value by \$17,336. The reduction has been approved by the City of Jamestown's finance and legal committee. A motion to approve the abatement request was made by Morris, seconded by Wolsky. Roll call vote: Bergquist, Wolsky, Morris, Taylor, and Klose voted aye. Motion carried.

Corry Shevlin, JSDC and Emily Bivens, Chamber of Commerce presented a request for funds to purchase and renovate the new office space for JSDC. A motion to approve the county's contribution was made by Wolsky, seconded by Bergquist. Roll call vote: Wolsky, Morris, Taylor, Klose, and Bergquist voted aye. Motion carried.

Bob Martin, County Weed Board Chairman, requested to reduce the County Weed Board from seven members to five members. The goal of the member reduction is to reduce operational costs and to avoid difficulty filling positions as the county representative has moved and the city representative is not interested in re-applying. Bergquist recommended advertising for the open positions and to table this item until a future meeting.

Jesse Christianson, Road Foreman, presented an update on the Motor Grader bid that was presented on October 15, 2024, stating that there was an error in the accounting and that there was an additional \$15,500 that was not included in the original presentation, bringing the total amount to \$377,300 after trade-in. A motion to re-consider the motion and approval to purchase made at the October 15, 2024 meeting was made by Morris, seconded by Bergquist. Motion carried. Taylor made a motion to accept the bid from RDO for \$377,300, seconded by Wolsky. Roll call vote: Morris, Taylor, Bergquist, and Wolsky voted aye. Klose voted nay. Motion carried.

Trent Messner, Butler Machinery, introduced Justin Stringer, Local Equipment Dealer, and Bill Van Epps, Service Manager to the commission. Messner wanted to make the county aware of the new changes in management to hopefully create a positive relationship between Butler and the County. Messner touched on the most recent two bids put out by the road department and his disappointment in the results.

Chad Jackson, Jail Administrator, requested to travel out of state on January 20 – 23, 2025 for Jail & Prisoner training in Las Vegas at a cost of approximately \$3,200. A motion to approve the out-of-state travel was made by Morris, seconded by Taylor. Roll call vote: Taylor, Klose, Bergquist, Wolsky, and Morris voted aye. Motion carried.

Mark Attleson, Maintenance Supervisor, requested permission to purchase snow tires for the bobcat for \$1,828.96. A motion to approve the purchase was made by Morris, seconded by Bergquist. Roll call vote: Klose, Bergquist, Wolsky, Morris, and Taylor voted aye. Motion carried.

Attleson requested permission to purchase pallet forks for the bobcat from Central Sales for \$1,400 since they are currently being borrowed from the Park Department. A motion to approve the purchase was made by Wolsky, seconded by Taylor. Roll call vote: Bergquist, Wolsky, Morris, Taylor, and Klose voted aye. Motion carried.

Attleson requested permission to replace the carpet on the 1<sup>st</sup> floor in the social service building at a cost of \$53,675.55. A motion to approve the replacement was made by Bergquist, seconded by Morris. Roll call vote: Wolsky, Morris, Taylor, Klose, and Bergquist voted aye. Motion carried.

Attleson informed the board the current water meters at the courthouse cannot be replaced until valves are updated. He received a quote from Heartland in the amount of \$6,000 and requested permission to begin the work. A motion to approve the request was made by Taylor, seconded by Wolsky. Roll call vote: Morris, Taylor, Klose, Bergquist, and Wolsky voted aye. Motion carried.

Fritz Fremgen, State's Attorney, presented his monthly report.

A motion to approve the 2025 Beer & Liquor licenses for Hondo's Hideaway, Jamestown Country Club, Buchanan Bar, Windsor Bar, Lazy Fish, Sportsman's Bar, Gettin' Sauced on 281, and Ypsilanti Bar & Grill was made by Morris, seconded by Bergquist. Roll call vote: Taylor, Klose, Bergquist, Wolsky, and Morris voted aye. Motion carried.

Chad Kaiser, Sheriff, presented the continued discussion on the non-departmental vehicle. Kaiser stated that he was not in favor of the leasing option due to the mileage that the assessor's office and vision zero position put on annually. A motion to approve the purchase of the 2024 Chevy Colorado for \$43,215 was made by Bergquist, seconded by Wolsky. Roll call vote: Klose, Bergquist, Wolsky, Morris, and Taylor voted aye. Motion carried.

Kaiser stated that Corrections is still short-staffed and requested that Scott Franke, Deputy Jail Administrator, start receiving overtime pay for transports until the staffing issue has been resolved. A motion to approve the overtime was made by Taylor, seconded by Bergquist. Roll call vote: Bergquist, Wolsky, Morris, Taylor, and Klose voted aye. Motion carried.

Jessica Alonge, Auditor/COO, presented the Beer & Liquor license for the remainder of 2024 for Gettin' Sauced on 281. Alonge stated that the 281 Stop had paid the fees for 2024 but has since sold the business to Gettin' Sauced on 281. Bergquist made a motion to authorize the 2024 Beer & Liquor license for Gettin' Sauced on 281 at no cost, seconded by Morris. Motion carried.

Alonge introduced the new Emergency Manager, Jessica Moser.

Alonge informed the commission that Karl Bergh, Park Superintendent, has gone on medical leave effective Monday, November 18, 2024, and does not have a set return date.

Alonge updated the commission on Maureen McGilvrey, Treasurer/Recorder. McGilvrey has been on FMLA leave since August 29, 2024, and does not have an approximate return date. Alonge will continue to fill in and intends on having tax statements mailed by mid-December.

Alonge requested to register Riley Schafer, Assistant Emergency Manager, for NACo High Performance Leadership Academy beginning in January. A motion to approve the \$1,995 registration was made by Taylor, seconded by Wolsky. Roll call vote: Wolsky, Morris, Taylor, Klose, and Bergquist voted aye. Motion carried.

Alonge requested permission for an ARPA Fund transfer to the Sheriff Capital Fund in the amount of \$607,969. A motion to approve the transfer was made by Bergquist, seconded by Taylor. Roll call vote: Morris, Taylor, Klose, Bergquist, and Wolsky voted aye. Motion carried.

Alonge presented an update on the 2023 audit and requested to move audits from the State Auditor's Office to Widmer Roel for the 2024 and future audits. Morris suggested putting this out to bid to compare it to other agencies. Alonge will obtain more information and quotes.

Alonge presented an update on the 2024 General Election. There was a total of 10,262 ballots cast.

At 2:59 p.m., the Commission recessed for the County Park Board meeting.

#### Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Park Board – November 19, 2024

At 3:06 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Park Board to order. Jerry Bergquist, Chad Wolsky, Joan Morris, Levi Taylor, Mark Klose, and Henry Steinberger were present. At 3:12 p.m. Merri Mooridian was present via phone.

A motion to approve the October 2024 meeting minutes was made by Wolsky, seconded by Morris. Motion carried.

Henry Steinberger, Park Board Member, presented an update on the proposed trail project. Steinberger stated that engineering plans for a parking lot are needed prior to grant submission. Steinberger stated that he has donation commitments of approximately \$10,000 by interested parties. Steinberger will reach out to Interstate Engineering before the next meeting.

Levi Taylor, Jerry Bergquist, and Merri Mooridian, Park Portfolio Members, presented park project updates and requests. Taylor reviewed the options for the island bridge. Taylor stated that the box culvert for the island bridge is being funded by a grant through the state. The original plan for the island bridge was estimated to cost approximately \$1.3 million, outside of the grant portion, which would include a grade raise, an expansion of the bike path, and a resurface up to the island. ARPA funds in the amount of \$800,000 were previously allocated for the out-of-pocket portion of the project. Taylor stated the portfolio met and discussed allocating those ARPA funds to other projects may be the best use of the funds. A motion to move forward with the replacement of the island bridge under the DOT grant application and de-obligate \$800,000 of

ARPA funds from local share of that project was made by Bergquist, seconded by Morris. Roll call vote: Taylor, Klose, Steinberger, Mooridian, Bergquist, Wolsky, and Morris voted aye.

Taylor stated that the portfolio had met with Interstate Engineering to discuss the parameters of the Park Portfolio's Master Plan project totals. Taylor stated that replacement of the Pelican Point bathhouse is estimated to cost approximately \$380,000, Boat Club upgrades including bringing in electricity and rural water, is estimated at approximately \$50,000, the walking path has not received an updated estimate from Border States but has an approximately amount of \$175,000, and the portfolio has advised signs, pedestrian safety lights, and temporary speed bumps for the park and path near Hondo's has an estimate of approximately \$10,000.

A motion for preliminary approval to allocate part of the de-obligated ARPA funds to the walking path from Hondo's to the Farmers Union Camp not to exceed \$175,000 was made by Morris, seconded by Taylor. Motion carried.

Steinberger made a motion for preliminary approval and advertisement for bids to replace the bathhouse at Pelican Point for a cost of up to \$380,000, seconded by Wolsky. Motion carried.

Morris made a motion to tentatively approve the Master Plan project of up to \$200,000, seconded by Bergquist. Motion carried.

Taylor made a motion to purchase speed bumps, signs and safety lights for up to \$10,000, seconded by Wolsky. Roll call vote: Klose, Steinberger, Mooridian, Bergquist, Wolsky, Morris, and Taylor voted aye. Motion carried.

A motion to approve the mid-monthly bills was made by Mooridian, seconded by Steinberger. Roll call vote: Steinberger, Mooridian, Bergquist, Wolsky, Morris, Taylor, and Klose voted aye. Motion carried.
