

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission—November 21, 2023

At 3:30 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Jerry Bergquist, Chad Wolsky, Joan Morris, and Mark Klose answered the roll call. Levi Taylor joined via telephone at 3:32.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Kara Falk, Executive Director, Central Valley Health, presented the plan for the use of the opioid settlement funds. The plan is to provide and support education to youth to discourage use of substances, to support the expansion of telehealth for crisis services, and to support warm hands-off services for transition to recovery services. A motion to approve the plan was made by Wolsky, seconded by Morris. Roll call vote: Bergquist, Wolsky, Morris, Taylor, and Klose voted aye. Motion carried.

A motion to transfer the \$31,215.27 from the opioid settlement to Central Valley Health was made by Bergquist, seconded by Wolsky. Roll call vote: Wolsky, Morris, Taylor, Klose, and Bergquist voted aye. Motion carried.

Shannon Davis, Human Resource Director, presented the 2024 NDPERS changes. She is requesting approval of contribution rates at 3% for the employee contribution, and 13.26% for the employer contribution. This is a 1% increase in the employee contribution. A motion to approve was made by Morris, seconded by Bergquist. Roll call vote: Morris, Taylor, Klose, Bergquist, and Wolsky voted aye. Motion carried.

Davis also presented the NDPERS Public Safety Plan for Law Enforcement. The plan would allow law enforcement officers and licensed peace officers to retire with the Rule of 85. New hires would automatically go on the plan, and current employees in Law Enforcement would get the option to stay with their current plan or join the Public Safety Retirement Plan. A motion to join the public safety retirement plan effective March 1, 2024, was made by Wolsky, seconded by Bergquist. Roll call vote: Taylor, Klose, Bergquist, Wolsky, and Morris voted aye. Motion carried.

A motion to approve the employer/employee contributions for the NDPERS Public Safety Plan as presented with the employee contribution being 4.78% and the employer contribution being 13.26% was made by Morris, seconded by Wolsky. Roll call vote: Klose, Bergquist, Wolsky, Morris, and Taylor voted aye. Motion carried.

Jessica Alonge, Auditor/COO, presented a request for changes in the 2024 raffle permit fees. The county has charged \$10.00 for these permit fees for several years and can charge up to \$100.00. A motion to increase raffle permit fees to \$25.00, beginning January 1, 2024, was made by Bergquist, seconded by Wolsky. Roll call vote: Bergquist, Wolsky, Morris, Taylor, and Klose voted aye. Motion carried.

Alonge then presented a discussion on reducing the number of City of Jamestown Precincts for the 2024 election cycle. There are currently six precincts within the city. One precinct is in Legislative District 29 and the other five are in Legislative District 12. The city council approved a request earlier this year and has a resolution on file. The change would reduce the number of ballot styles on election day. The vote center location would not change. Bernie Satrom, Chairman of District 12 Republicans, and Cole Conley, State Senator, District 12, requested the Commission leave the number of precincts the same. Precincts must be approved by December 31, 2023. Gail Kollman, Kensal, 2nd Vice Chair District 29 GOP, and past

election judge questioned if this would change the number of election workers. Alonge informed her that this decision would not affect election workers, and discussion regarding workers would be held at another time. Ann Hoggarth, District 29 Chair, stated she did not believe there were enough workers in the 2022 general election. This item was tabled to the December 5, 2023, Commission meeting.

Chad Kaiser, Sheriff, spoke about House Bill 1307, Back the Blue funding, which was approved in Legislative Session for the State of North Dakota. Stutsman County has 13 law enforcement officers and 24 correctional officers eligible for the funding. The county received \$52,516, which would be equally dispersed between all eligible officers as a one-time bonus of \$1,419 per officer. A motion to authorize Sheriff Kaiser to expend Back the Blue grant funds approved in House Bill 1307 which was passed by the 2023 Legislature for the categories outlined as follows: providing hiring and retention bonuses to new and current law enforcement and correctional officers and providing tuition and fee payments on behalf of law enforcement trainees was made by Wolsky, seconded by Bergquist. Roll call vote: Wolsky, Morris, Taylor, Klose, and Bergquist voted aye. Motion carried.

Jim Wentland, Highway Superintendent, requested to replace the garage door on the Cleveland Shop. He received quotes from Infinity, Jim's Garage Doors, and Schumacher's. Schumacher's had the lowest quote at \$9,041 for a 2-inch insulated door. A motion to approve the replacement by Schumacher's was made by Bergquist, seconded by Morris. Roll call vote: Morris, Taylor, Klose, Bergquist, and Wolsky voted aye. Motion carried.

At 4:22 p.m., the Commission meeting recessed for the Park Board meeting.

Alonge stated that the Park Board received a spraying bill from the Weed Department. Klose would like to have a member of the Weed Board come to the December 5 meeting to discuss what sort of agreement could be made regarding charges/payments between county departments.

A motion to approve the mid-month bills was made by Bergquist, seconded by Mooridian. Roll call vote: Taylor, Klose, Mooridian, Bergquist, Wolsky, and Morris voted aye. Motion carried.
