At 4:00 p. m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, David Schwartz, Craig Neys and Mark T. Klose answered roll call.

A motion to approve the minutes from October meetings was made by Ova and seconded by Schwartz. Motion Carried.

The Tiger Cub Den of Cub Scout Troop 145 from Jamestown comprising: Zachary Holben, Ethan Igl, Samuel Olsen, Steven Schmitz, and Maguire Stoudt were introduced to the County Board.

Scott Wegner, Bond Counsel, from Arntson Stewart Wegner PC presented the Capital Financing Program through the Public Finance Authority. Mr. Wegner answered a variety of questions about the program and explained that if the county was interested that an application and final adoption of the resolutions needed to be made before the end of the year. Because of Initiated Measure 2 on the June Ballot, beginning in January of 2012 local units of government will not be allowed to issue General Obligation property tax backed bonds until it is determined if this law will go into effect.

A motion was made by Ova and Seconded by Schwartz to approve Auditor/COO Bradley to submit an application on behalf of the county to cover the county's portion of the projected 2012 ER projects. Roll call vote: Ova, Marks, Schwartz, Neys, and Klose voted aye.

Connie Ova, CEO, from JSDC presented a proposal for JSDC to form a new entity with Great River Energy called SEPA or Spiritwood Energy Park Association. Mrs. Ova and Sandra Broekema, Great River Energy, presented the anticipated financials as well as the potential opportunities that will be available for new industries as a result of the formation of SEPA. Mrs. Broekema stated that currently the Board of Trustees for Great River Energy as well as the City of Jamestown has voted to continue with this project as presented. Currently the proposal would authorize the formation of SEPA contingent on Midwest AgEnergy Group and Dakota Spirit AgEnergy project financing. It would also authorize JSDC to transfer ownership of 100 acres of land to SEPA to be combined with 451 acres of Great River Energy's land for use as an industrial park. Furthermore, it would authorize a capital investment of \$3.75 million to SEPA of which \$375,000 would be County Property Tax dollars.

Commissioner Schwartz voiced his concerns over the increased commercial traffic on unimproved county roads currently connected to the proposed project area. Al Christianson, Manager North Dakota Business Development & Government Affairs Great River Energy, stated that they would be willing to consider cost sharing improvements in these areas based on the overall benefit to all industries impacted rather than just Great River Energy burdening these costs outside of the project area.

State's Attorney Fritz Fremgen asked several questions over the collateral of assets covered within the special assessment district to back the bond repayments for road improvements that have been proposed. Al Christianson stated that Great River Energy currently has a 30 year contract in place with an industrial user of its steam from the power plant. Therefore, they have a

long-term commitment to the park in addition to the amount of capital they have invested in this park.

A motion was made by Ova and seconded by Neys to give authorization to proceed with the formation of SEPA with the commitment of 100 acres of JSDC land and up to \$375,000 for the County's portion of JSDC funding. Authorization shall be contingent upon Dakota Spirit AgEnergy's ability to obtain project financing as well as overall agreement on the legal documents. Roll call vote: Marks, Neys, Klose, and Ova voted Aye. Schwartz voted no. Motion carried 4-1.

Connie Ova presented a listing of Stutsman County Job Incentive Fund projects that have been currently obligated and for various reasons the funding has not been requested for these projects and JSDC recommends de-obligating the funding at this time.

The projects presented are Gavilon-NJTF \$44,000, Biomass Crops \$2,000, and National Buffalo Foundation Waterline Grant \$2,140 for a total of \$48,140. A motion was made by Marks and seconded by Schwartz to de-obligate the funds as presented. Motion Carried.

A motion was made by Marks and seconded by Ova to submit a request to JSDC to provide the \$25,000 funding for the Stutsman County Transportation Study that had been previously authorized. Motion Carried.

Randy Pope, Principal Engineer, Interstate Engineering requested approval of 2012 ER Project preliminary engineering costs to be submitted to the state DOT for review. He stated that the estimate is roughly \$510,000 which is substantially below the initial estimate. A motion by Neys and second by Schwartz to approve the submittal to the ND DOT as presented. Motion carried.

Micky Nenow, County Highway Superintendent, requested that the lone gravel crushing bid be rejected for noncompliance with bid requirements and authorization to rebid sometime in the spring. A motion was made by Schwartz and second by Marks to reject the gravel crushing bid and authorize rebidding in the spring. Motion carried.

Auditor/COO Bradley informed the board that Micky Nenow was still in interim status as the County Highway Superintendent and that the current job description had been rerated at a 17 which is one step over the current grade of 16. A motion was made by Marks and seconded by Schwartz to begin advertising for the County Highway Superintendent position at the pay grade of 17. Motion carried.

Jerry Bergquist, County Emergency Manager, informed the board that he had been notified that Stutsman County had been selected for a 100% funded Homeland Security Radio Equipment Grant in the amount of \$65,470.18 to fund a variety of mobile and portable radio costs for multiple agencies in Stutsman County. A motion was made by Ova and seconded by Neys to accept the Homeland Security Radio Equipment Grant. Motion carried.

Emergency Manager Bergquist presented an Agreement to Jointly Operate The Stutsman County Communications Center. He informed the board of the minor revisions that had been made since this was initially presented previously. A motion was made by Schwartz and seconded by Neys to accept the agreement with the revisions. Roll call vote: Schwartz, Neys, Klose, Ova, and Marks voted ave.

Jim Fettig, Maintenance Supervisor, informed the board that a review of the bids for the bathroom remodel project had been completed and recommended awarding the bid to Hillerud Construction in the amount of \$42,150. While Hillerud wasn't the low bidder they were the lowest bidder who met the bid requirements. A motion was made by Schwartz and seconded by Marks to award the bid to Hillerud Construction. Roll call vote: Neys, Klose, Ova, Marks, and Schwartz vote aye.

Auditor/COO Bradley informed the board that previous Auditor/COO Noel Johnson had formally submitted his resignation effective December 31, 2011. With this the county would need to reappoint a Zoning Administrator and Superintendent of Schools. It is Auditor/COO Bradley's recommendation to appoint himself as the Superintendent of Schools and Staff Appraiser Dustin Bakken as the Zoning Administrator. A motion was made by Neys and seconded by Schwartz to appoint Auditor/COO Bradley as the Superintendent of Schools Designee and Staff Appraiser Dustin Bakken as the Zoning Administrator. Motion carried.

Auditor/COO Bradley presented the two Airport Board nominees for appointment effective January 1, 2012. Commissioner Neys indicated that Keith Veil was the only nominee that had contacted him to express his interest in serving on the Airport Board. A motion was made by Neys and seconded by Ova to appoint Keith Veil to the Airport Board. Roll call vote: Klose, Ova, Marks, Schwartz, and Neys voted aye.

A motion was made by Ova and seconded by Marks to nominate the following individuals for consideration to serve on the respective boards: Dale Reimers Weed Board, Anthony Roorda Water Resource Board, Rory Hoffmann Buffalo City Tourism, and Sandy Bendewald Human Service Council. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Ova and seconded by Schwartz to approve the following Beer License Applications: Shawndell Gudmestad-Moore d/b/a Hitching Post Bar, Jamestown Country Club, Ron Davis d/b/a Cuz'n Ron's Saloon, Carmel Demaray d/b/a Windsor Bar, Krewzer's Dream Inc. (Bob & Kris Wenzel) d/b/a Buchanan Bar, Judit Ganser d/b/a Anchor Bar, Sandra Norquist d/b/a Ypsilanti Bar & Grill, Stutsman County Fair Association, Joey Uehran d/b/a 281 Stop, Wayne & Hilda Kuntz d/b/a Sportsman Bar & Café. Motion carried.

Sheriff Chad Kaiser gave an update on the status of the missing person at the Jamestown Reservoir. He indicated that there may be additional expenses that are incurred as a result of the resources that are being brought in to aid in the search. This could cause his budget to be exceeded in some areas.

A motion was made by Schwartz and seconded by Ney's to approve Gamming Site Authorization application submitted by the North Dakota Buffalo Foundation, Inc. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Ova and seconded by Schwartz to approve the Application for a Local Permit or Charity Local Permit submitted by the James River Humane Society. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Marks and seconded by Ova to approve the bills as presented. Roll call vote: Ova, Marks, Schwartz, Neys, and Klose voted aye.

After the public was asked to leave the closed session was attended by Commissioners Ova, Marks, Schwartz, Neys, Klose as well as Auditor/COO Bradley and State's Attorney Fremgen.

At 6:21 pm a motion was made by Marks and seconded by Schwartz to end closed session.

The public was allowed to reenter the commissioner's room before commencement of the board meeting.

A motion was made by Schwartz and seconded by Marks to authorize State's Attorney Fremgen to negotiate a settlement with Green Tree Servicing. Motion carried.

At 6:23 p. m., a motion was made by Schwartz and seconded by Marks to adjourn the commission meeting. Motion carried.
