Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission—December 20, 2022

At 3:30 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Jerry Bergquist, Chad Wolsky, Joan Morris, Steven Cichos and Mark Klose answered the roll call.

Mitch Gunderson, City of Medina, and Tom Klabunde, Moore Engineering, presented a request for assistance with funds to repave county roads 39 and 68, and possibly reduce the width from 60' to 40'. The portion of road was chip sealed last year but will be dug up to replace water and sewer infrastructure. The city has funds to replace the portion of road above the water lines that they will dig up, but they would like to pave the entire road. No action was taken by the commission because budgeting for the 2023 year is already complete.

Corry Shevlin, JSDC, presented the Daycare Expansion Project and requested county share of \$10,000. The program would cover 50% of costs for daycares to do construction for expansion of their facility, which would allow the facility to expand their license for the number of children they can care for. A motion was made to approve by Cichos, seconded by Wolsky. Roll call vote: Bergquist, Wolsky, Morris, Cichos, and Klose voted aye. Motion carried.

Shevlin also presented the 2023 FlexPace program with the county share being \$100,000. FlexPace is an interest buy down program with the Bank of North Dakota. A motion to approve was made by Bergquist, seconded by Wolsky. Roll call vote: Wolsky, Morris, Cichos, Klose and Bergquist voted aye. Motion carried.

An updated list of board appointments and committee assignments for Commissioners was presented. A motion to approve was made by Cichos, seconded by Morris. Motion carried.

Jessica Alonge, Auditor/COO, presented a letter received just prior to the start of the meeting regarding the continued discussion on health insurance. Jon Heath, from Brown and Brown, the consultant for the trust was present via telephone. Shannon Davis, Human Resource Director, pointed out a few items listed in the correspondence regarding termination that the county should be aware of before deciding. The Commission requested representatives for NDPHIT send written notice to the County indicating whether or not the County would be able to stay on the current plan in 2024 if they issue the required one year notice to terminate participation in the trust and later approve maintaining the current plan with NDPHIT, and whether or not they would be considered a new member. Heath indicated they would provide these answers by the end of the week. A special meeting was scheduled for Tuesday, December 27th, at 9:00 a.m. to make a final decision on the matter.

Beer and Liquor License Applications were presented for the Stutsman County Fair Association, Jamestown Country Club, Ypsi Bar & Grill, Windsor Bar, and the Hitchin' Post. A motion to approve was made by Cichos, seconded by Bergquist. Motion carried.

At 4:24 p.m., the Commission recessed for the County Park Board meeting.

At 4:25 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Park Board to order. Jerry Bergquist, Chad Wolsky, Joan Morris, Mark Klose, Steven Cichos, Robert Martin, and Merri Mooridian (via phone) answered the roll call.

Alonge, presented information on 2023 grazing and hay land permits. Several people have contacted Karl Bergh, Park Superintendent, that are adjacent landowners to some of the properties that the county has been renting out. They would like the opportunity to bid on the use of the land. Some research would need to be done prior to putting the land up for bids, including which sections have adjacent owners, doing an onsite inspection to see if the land is accessible and finding out who owns the fences. A follow up is needed with the bureau to get answers to some of the grazing and hayland questions.

A motion was made to approve the mid-month bills by Cichos, seconded by Martin. Roll call vote: Morris, Cichos, Klose, Martin, Mooridian, Bergquist and Wolsky. Motion carried.
