

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission

December 21, 2010

At 8:00 a.m., Chairman Klose called the mid-month meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, Craig Neys, David Schwartz and Mark T. Klose answered roll call.

A motion was made by Neys seconded by Ova to make the following Board appointments: Weed Board – Robert Martin; LEC Governing Board – James Nygaard; Water Resource Board – Joel Lees and Arlyn Schmidt; and Buffalo City Tourism – David Smette. Roll call vote – Ova, Marks, Schwartz, Neys and Klose voted aye.

Bids were opened for the restroom remodeling project. Ova made a motion seconded by Schwartz to table the bids to review compliance with bid specifications. Motion carried.

Lindsey Larson, JSDC Marketing/Business Development Specialist, presented a request from RTS Shearing, Inc. for new jobs training funds. The JSDC Board was recommending approval of \$100,269 on an 80/20 City/County split. RTS Shearing was eligible for these funds based on 15 new full time jobs. The 1% 10 year amortized loan was backed by personal guarantees and security through subordination of collateral from their primary bank. Schwartz made a motion seconded by Neys to approve \$20,054 in County funds. Roll call vote – Marks, Schwartz, Neys, Klose and Ova voted aye.

Chad Kaiser, Sheriff Elect, presented his recommendation to accept the low bid of Don Wilhelm, Inc. for a new Sheriff's Department vehicle. Marks made a motion seconded by Neys to accept the \$16,505 net bid for a 2011 GMC Sierra 1500 Crew Cab 4WD Pickup. Roll call vote – Schwartz, Neys, Klose, Ova and Marks voted aye.

Eunice Sahr, County Agent, announced her retirement effective February 28, 2011. She thanked the Commission for her years of employment. Mike Hanson, District Director NDSU Extension Service, inquired whether or not the Commission wanted to continue to partner with NDSU and fill the position. The salary would be split 50/50 between the Extension Service and Stutsman County. Benefits would be paid by NDSU. Marks made a motion seconded by Schwartz to continue to partner with the NDSU Extension Service and fill the position. Motion carried. Commissioners Ova and Marks would serve on the committee to select a replacement. The Commission thanked Eunice for her years of service and wished her well.

Chad Kaiser, Sheriff Elect, reported that Casey Yunck had been hired as the new deputy in the Sheriff's Department. He had served as a Jamestown City Policeman and was a certified police officer. Ova made a motion seconded by Marks to place Mr. Yunck on the County pay system at grade 10 step 2. Motion carried.

Mike Zimmerman, County Highway Superintendent, presented 15 sites as potential ER (Emergency Relief) projects for next year. The cost of all the projects was estimated at \$8.4 million. The County's share of the cost would be 20% or about \$1.7 million. Two of these sites - #7 & #13 – on old Highway #10 between Cleveland and Medina would cost about \$4.8 million. All farm land and all residences could still be accessed if these sites were not completed and left under water. They could be removed from the Federal Aid System and then potentially qualify as FEMA projects. Marks made a motion seconded by Schwartz to proceed with all the ER projects except # 7 and # 13 provided all farm land and residences had alternate access. Roll call vote – Neys, Klose, Ova, Marks and Schwartz voted aye.

Steve Thompson, Interstate Engineering, provided an update on the Gavilon road project. There were no recorded documents for any right of way along either the north-south or east-west roads along the project. ND DOT would require right of way acquisition before the projects could proceed. Lowering the speed on the roads could negate the major utility relocation issues. The estimated cost of the project would increase to about \$1.5 million with the right of way plus potential wetland mitigation. Marks made a motion seconded by Ova to obtain letters of commitment from all parties authorizing the County to proceed with the project. Motion carried.

Renee Valenta, Wellness Committee Member, requested continuation of the County's wellness program. The program encouraged employees to participate in healthy lifestyle choices. The employees could earn up to 4 hours wellness time every 6 months by full participation in the program. Johnson indicated that the annual cost to the county was about \$900 while the 0.5% reduction in health insurance premiums saved the County about \$5,000. Ova made a motion seconded by Schwartz to continue the program for another year. Motion carried.

Howie Peuser, LEC Maintenance Supervisor, and Tracy Trapp, LEC Administrator, apprised the Commission on the roof replacement at the Law Enforcement Center. Peuser had obtained estimates from a company that used vinyl instead of the conventional built-up tar method for replacing flat roofs. The vinyl had a longer warranty and was cheaper. Cost estimates were about 25% less for a vinyl roof. A motion was made by Ova seconded by Marks to proceed with bids for a roof replacement on the LEC. Motion carried.

Johnson requested permission to advertise for a Director of Tax Equalization. Funding the position was in the budget. Ova made a motion seconded by Schwartz to advertise for a Director of Tax Equalization. Motion carried.

Commissioner Schwartz reviewed several concerns that he had with Road Superintendent Zimmerman. FEMA paper work not completed; his not living in Jamestown; employee moral; lack of his presence when the men were working on weekends; and several other matters were voiced by Schwartz. Klose commented that many issues would be reviewed during the annual employee evaluation with the Commissioners that hold the road portfolio. Zimmerman requested that the Commissioners hear both sides of the story then do an evaluation of the issues. Klose, Neys and Marks reported on different times that they had traveled on Old Highway 10 East to the County line. Many problems deal with excess speed by drivers.

Zimmerman recommended that they continue with the grinding of Old Highway #10, do traffic studies during 2010 and study the matrix system for 2011 plans. Klose said to put this topic of the next agenda to allow for planning time.

Commissioner Marks reported that at the annual meeting the Township Officers had voted 14 to 12 in favor of allowing 105,500 loads for trailers with pups. Commissioner Klose recommended obtaining advice from ND DOT and getting other solid engineering advice before the County acted on increasing the haul limits.

Marks made a motion seconded by Ova to pay \$520.00 in taxable meals. Roll call vote – Klose, Ova, Marks, Schwartz and Neys voted aye.

A motion to approve the mid month bills was made by Neys seconded by Schwartz. Roll call vote – Ova, Marks, Schwartz, Neys, and Klose voted aye.
