

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission – March 16, 2021

At 3:30 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Dennis Ova, Ramone Gumke, Joan, Morris, Steven Cichos (via phone), and Mark Klose answered the roll call.

Connie Ova, JSDC, discussed the JSDC Internship program. This would be geared toward college students. When a local business hires an intern, JSDC will reimburse 50% of payroll costs up to \$3,500. There will be a committee to select the interns. The requested amount from the county is \$21,000. Gumke made a motion to approve, seconded by Morris. Roll call vote: Ova, Gumke, Morris, Cichos, and Klose voted aye. Motion carried.

Ova discussed a reimbursement for 2020 property taxes and special assessment for JSDC properties. This is an annual request because JSDC is not allowed to pay property taxes. The amount requested from the county is \$244.32. Gumke made a motion to approve, seconded by Ova. Roll call vote: Gumke, Morris, Cichos, Klose, and Ova voted aye. Motion carried.

Ova discussed the Center for Economic Development loss reimbursement for \$907.86. Rent from their current tenant will hopefully pay for this expense in the future. Gumke made a motion to approve, seconded by Ova. Roll call vote: Morris, Cichos, Klose, Ova, and Gumke voted aye. Motion carried.

Chad Kaiser, County Sheriff, gave an update on his department. They budgeted for a new pickup this year and he requested quotes from Stoudt's and Wilhelm's. Wilhelm gave a quote of \$38,481 for a 2021 truck. They would keep the older truck as a spare and sell the current spare vehicle. Ova made a motion to approve the purchase, seconded by Cichos. Roll call vote: Cichos, Klose, Ova, Gumke, and Morris voted aye. Motion carried.

Mickey Nenow, Highway Superintendent, reviewed the quotes he received for a new backhoe. He would like to go with RDO for a John Deere with a 5-year warranty, along with a front bucket for \$44,235. He budgeted \$100,000 for the backhoe. Gumke made a motion to approve the purchase, seconded by Ova. Roll call vote: Klose, Ova, Gumke, Morris, and Cichos voted aye. Motion carried.

Nenow discussed the use of NDDOT CRRSAA funds for the road project west of Medina. The county received \$120,069 that must be used all at once. Cichos made a motion to approve, seconded by Ova. Motion carried.

Klose discussed the right of way appraisals for the West End Bridge Project. Tyler Perleberg put together a value estimate to acquire the land for the project. Cichos made a motion to approve the appraisal amounts for the land acquisition, seconded by Ova. Motion carried.

Fritz Fremgen, State's Attorney, discussed contracting with a remote attorney. They have one open position for an assistant attorney and the other assistant is new. Lillie Schoenack, a previous Assistant State's Attorney, has contacted Fremgen. She has opened a private practice in Minnesota and is willing to do remote work for the county. Fremgen suggested \$50 per hour. She would be considered a temporary employee. There would be no benefits included and she would not be able to exceed 25

hours per week. She would be provided a county laptop. Gumke made a motion to enter into the agreement, seconded by Ova. Roll call vote: Ova, Gumke, Morris, Cichos, and Klose voted aye. Motion carried.

At 4:04 p.m., the County Commission recessed for the County Park Board meeting.

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Park Board – March 16, 2021

At 4:05 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Park Board meeting was called to order. Dennis Ova, Ramone Gumke, Joan, Morris, Steven Cichos (via phone), Robert Martin, Jason Houge and Mark Klose answered the roll call.

Karl Bergh discussed the 2021 hay land permit. The same tenant would like to hay the land again. There are approximately 30 acres and the tenant pays \$1,500. Gumke made a motion to approve the permit, seconded by Morris. Motion carried.

Bill Steinmetz discussed walking trails at Spiritwood Lake and another at the Reservoir. The trail at the reservoir would go south of the county shop. At Spiritwood Lake, Bill would cut the initial trail and residents at the lake would maintain it. It would be 4.04 miles. He would like to pave part of the trail and would apply for a grant to pay for it. Klose would like the city of Spiritwood Lake to talk to Eric at Spiritwood Resort and bring an agreement to the Park Board. There will be no expense to the Park Board besides using some equipment, materials, and labor. Houge made a motion to approve the trail at the Reservoir, seconded by Ova. Motion carried.

Karl Bergh discussed a request from Lazy Fish LLC to replace the flooring in the cabins. The county will be responsible for the expense since the cabins are county property, and Lazy Fish will do the installation. It will cost approximately \$700 for all four cabins. Gumke made a motion to approve, seconded by Martin. Gumke, Morris, Cichos, Klose, Martin, Houge, and Ova voted aye. Motion carried. A window at the Marina building also needs to be replaced due to water damage. This will cost approximately \$700. Cichos made a motion to approve, seconded by Gumke. Motion carried.

Sheriff Kaiser announced that they were approved for a grant to purchase new buoys for both swimming areas at the reservoir.

Martin made a motion, seconded by Ova, to approve the monthly bills. Roll call vote: Morris, Cichos, Klose, Martin, Houge, Ova, and Gumke voted aye. Motion carried.
