

## Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission – April 6, 2021

At 3:30 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Dennis Ova, Joan Morris, Steven Cichos, and Mark Klose answered the roll call. Ramone Gumke was absent.

Morris made a motion, seconded by Cichos, to approve the March 2021 meeting minutes. Motion carried.

Gumke joined the meeting via phone.

Mickey Nenow, Highway Superintendent, presented his monthly report. Road restrictions are still in place. Seasonal employees are returning to work.

Nenow requested approval to purchase a new flatbed car trailer at a cost of \$14,000. Cichos made a motion, seconded by Ova, to approve the request. Roll call vote: Ova, Gumke, Morris, Cichos and Klose voted aye. Motion carried.

Tammy Ibach and Robert Harms from North Dakotans for Comprehensive Energy Solutions presented a Wind Energy update. Some questions were answered.

Klose had a conference call with the North Dakota Department of Transportation and the City of Jamestown. The City of Jamestown is not willing to accept the ownership on the First Street Bridge. The bridge needs to be inspected, per a requirement. The local share of the inspection is \$1,000-1,200. The inspection is eligible for Federal Aid. An agreement was discussed with the City of Jamestown to do a 50/50 payment for the inspection fee only. Cichos made a motion to make half the payment with a letter included, seconded by Ova. Roll call vote: Gumke, Morris, Cichos, Klose and Ova voted aye. Motion carried.

Philip Hofmann, on behalf of Jacob Hofmann, Peterson Township, requested a township loan in the amount of \$40,505 to complete a FEMA project. Payment will be made upon receipt of FEMA reimbursement. Cichos made a motion, seconded by Morris, to approve the presented request. Roll call vote: Morris, Cichos, Klose, Ova and Gumke voted aye. Motion carried.

Jerry Bergquist, current Emergency Manager, introduced the new Emergency Manager, Andrew Kirking. The new Assistant Emergency Manager, Riley Schafer, introduced himself.

Kirking requested consideration to declare a Fire Emergency for Stutsman County. Bergquist recommended going ahead with the proposed declaration. This is not related to the ordinance. Ova made a motion to enter into the Fire Emergency Declaration, seconded by Morris. Motion carried.

Bergquist presented the Jamestown River at Jamestown, ND streamgage historical annual flow volume. The 2021 forecasted flow volume was also shown.

Bergquist presented an update on the Motorola Replacement Radio Console and 9-1-1 Equipment Replacement projects.

At 4:10 p.m., the County Commission recessed for the County Park Board meeting.

Chairman Klose called the Stutsman County Park Board meeting to order. Dennis Ova, Ramone Gumke (via phone), Joan Morris, Steven Cichos, Mark Klose, Robert Martin and Jason Houge answered the roll call.

Ova made a motion to approve the March 2021 meeting minutes, seconded by Houge. Motion carried.

Karl Bergh, Park Superintendent, presented an EZ Wheels Shrine update on the sinking vehicle on Little Britches Pond. The commission was thanked for allowing this charity event to be possible and they would like to do it again next year.

Jessica Alonge, Interim Auditor/COO, presented a dock permit revision. One sentence was added, from the request of the Sheriff, to require safety lights on each dock. Houge made a motion, seconded by Ova, to approve the revision. Martin recommended requiring all docks on the reservoir to have lights. Motion carried.

The North Dakota Farmers Union sign placements were presented and discussed. Cichos made a motion, seconded by Martin, to approve the request. Motion carried. NDFU is about 30-days ahead of schedule. The Grand Opening will be in June.

Ron Manson, Weed Control Officer, requested to be reimbursed for work done for the Stutsman County Park Board. Stutsman County recently took on 4,430 acres of land. Manson is requesting hourly wage reimbursement and cost of chemical.

The Pelican Point Expansion update was presented from Daren Peterka, Interstate Engineering. There is a remaining amount of \$4,714.55 for retainage from last year. Two pieces of information are still needed. Peterka is requesting approval to close out the contract contingent on obtaining the sewer videos and the electrical certification. Houge made a motion to approve the presented request, seconded by Ova. Roll call vote: Cichos, Klose, Martin, Houge, Ova, Gumke and Morris voted aye. Motion carried.

Houge made a motion, seconded by Martin, to approve the bills. Roll call vote: Klose, Martin, Houge, Ova, Gumke, Morris and Cichos voted aye. Motion carried.
